This qualification is intended for learners of English as an additional language who wish to develop their English language proficiency to pursue an academic pathway.

Graduates will have the language skills required to communicate independently and effectively in familiar and some less familiar situations with fluency and flexibility in academic contexts where English is the medium of instruction.
