Purpose	Learners credited with this unit standard are able to demonstrate understanding of a variety of written Gagana Tokelau texts on familiar topics.
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Classification	Languages > Gagana Tokelau
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Available grade	Achieved, Merit, and Excellence
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Criteria for Merit	Demonstrate clear understanding of written Gagana Tokelau texts on familiar topics. Clear understanding is demonstrated by selecting the key information, ideas, and/or opinions from the texts and clearly communicating their meaning.
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Criteria for Excellence	Demonstrate thorough understanding of written Gagana Tokelau texts on familiar topics. Thorough understanding is demonstrated by expanding on the key information, ideas, and opinions from the texts with supporting detail and justify conclusions.
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Guidance Information

- 1 This unit standard can be awarded with an Achieved, Merit, or Excellence grade. For the Achieved grade to be awarded, the outcome must be achieved as specified in the outcome statement. For Merit or Excellence grades to be awarded, the learner must meet the Merit or Excellence criteria specified above.
- 2 *Gagana Tokelau* refers to the authentic language of Tokelau as communicated in the Pacific Island nation and in New Zealand.
- 3 It is recommended that:
 - i the outcomes are assessed as part of an integrated unit of work, relevant to the learning context of the learner;
 - ii assessment be conducted in conjunction with assessment against other Gagana Tokelau unit standards at this level.
- 4 For this unit standard, texts:
 - i must each be approximately 350 - 450 words;
 - ii must be familiar and relevant;
 - iii must not have been seen by the learner prior to the assessment.

5 Definition

Familiar topics refers to regularly encountered information, ideas and opinions that will be expressed in clear standard written Gagana Tokelau, for example: takaloga (sports), aganuku (cultural), meakai (food), kāiga (family), lotu (church), nuku/komiuniti (community), tūma nā aga (traditions), fakamanatuga/fakafiafiaga (celebrations), hiva ma pehe (sing and dance), iloa o te kauhauatea (the wisdom of the elders), myths and legends.

Variety refers to texts selected from a range of different text types which have been created for different audiences and purposes.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Demonstrate understanding of a variety of written Gagana Tokelau texts on familiar topics.

Range a minimum of three different text types is required.

Performance criteria

1.1 A response to each text is given in either English, te reo Māori and/or Gagana Tokelau that shows understanding by making sense of the information, ideas and opinions in the texts.

Range a response may include – clarifying information, summarising information, ideas and/or opinions; producing, annotating, amending, or rephrasing Gagana Tokelau statements for a different and/or specific purpose e.g., making a recommendation, giving advice.
