
Section 5: Types of discourse/texts for General, Academic and Employment contexts



NZCEL qualifications in Level 3, Level 4, and Level 5 enable language development in three settings, **academic**, **employment**, and **general**. Suggested examples of the types of discourse that can be taught and assessed at these different levels are tabled below.
