## Introduction

The Top Scholar Awards recognise the highest achieving students from the 2024 New Zealand Scholarship examinations.

The Top Scholar Awards ceremony was initiated by the New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA) | Mana Tohu Mātauranga o Aotearoa in 1991 and the first awards were hosted at Government House, Wellington, in April of that year.

Following the introduction of New Zealand Scholarship in 2004, the awards became the New Zealand Scholarship Top Scholar Awards. Two types of awards were presented – Top Subject Scholar Awards and Premier Awards.

In 2011, the Prime Minister's Award for Academic Excellence was established and presented for the first time.

### About the awards

#### **Top Subject Scholar Awards**

Top Subject Scholar Awards recognise the highest achieving student in an individual New Zealand Scholarship subject. There are 37 Top Subject Scholar Awards.

#### **Premier Awards**

Premier Awards recognise the top New Zealand Scholarship students. At this year's ceremony, there are 12 Premier Award winners.

#### **Prime Minister's Award for Academic Excellence**

The Prime Minister's Award for Academic Excellence recognises the success of the highest achieving New Zealand Scholarship student. The winner will have the highest overall level of academic excellence of the Premier Award winners.

The Premier Award winners and the winner of the Prime Minister's Award for Academic Excellence have been recommended to NZQA by the Technical Overview Group Assessment (TOGA).

TOGA is chaired by Professor Jenny Poskitt and includes some of New Zealand's leading academic experts in assessment – Professor Don Klinger (Deputy Chair), Professor Gavin Brown, Professor Jeffrey Smith, Professor Sharleen Forbes, Dr Charles Darr, Dr Maraea Hunia (Mātaatua, Te Arawa, Tainui), Dr Earl Irving, Dr Michael Johnston, Dr Elliot Lawes, and Dr Piata Allen (Ngāti Kahungunu, Ngāti Hinemanu, Ngā Wairiki Ngāti Apa).

## **Premier Scholars**

#### **Clara Ballantyne**

Columba College

Outstanding Scholarships: Art History, English, History and Statistics

Scholarship: Geography

Top Subject Scholar: English and History

Clara was Dux of Columba College, where she served as an Academic Prefect. She was the Captain of her school and regional debating teams and lead the New Zealand Secondary School team to the World Competition in Serbia.

A former competitive dancer, Clara performed at the Red Cross Humanitarian Concert for Ukraine and achieved high honours in both Cecchetti Ballet and Jazz Dance. She has been involved in various volunteer activities, including tutoring ESOL students, coaching debate teams, and raising money for girls schooling in Kenya and Tanzania as part of the 'So They Can' initiative. Clara is passionate about equity in women's health and has participated in both the New Zealand Model Parliament and Model United Nations.

Clara is the recipient of the Girdlers' Scholarship for 2025 and will study History and Politics at the University of Cambridge. She intends to pursue a career in diplomacy or foreign policy, with a particular focus on Pacific relations and climate change impacts.

Mason was previously recognised as the Top Subject Scholar in Media Studies as a Year 11 student. He achieved this award again as a Year 12 student, adding awards for Art History and Religious Studies. Now completing Year 13 at Westlake, Mason serves as a Prefect and represents the school at debating, competing in the Premier Advanced League.

A talented musician, Mason enjoys playing the piano and writing music, and is a member of the Westlake Symphonic Band. He has created several short films and media projects, contributing to the media teams for Westlake's Academic Council and UNICEF.

Possessing a talent for writing, Mason contributes to the student newspaper and in 2024 won the Paul Seideman Scholarship for his essay evaluating how Holocaust commemoration has changed over time.

Mason plans to pursue a double major in English and Philosophy at university, aiming for an eventual Master's Degree and a future in lecturing or writing.

William served as the leader of Auckland Grammar School's Amnesty International Group and was involved with football, table tennis, the Premier Chamber Orchestra, and the Headmaster's Committees. Beyond school, he competed in the New Zealand Maths Olympiad, was the head organiser of the 2024 Auckland Science Bowl Competition and a geometry instructor for MINDNZ, a nonprofit organization offering maths problem solving tutorials to high school students via Zoom. In 2023, he won the New Zealand Young Physicists' Tournament, and in 2024, he was selected to be part of the New Zealand Young Physicists' Tournament Squad from which the national team was chosen. He also received the Flying Officer Alfred P. Fogerty Memorial Scholarship for ranking first in Year 12 at his school, the Gold Award at the New Zealand Chemistry Olympiad and was a shortlisted candidate for the Sir Douglas Myers Scholarship.

He is currently studying a Bachelor of Science majoring in Mathematics at the University of Auckland.

Throughout her time at Rangitoto College, Lianne was a member of the Academic Committee, participated in the Premier Advanced debating team, and served as a debating coach. She volunteered to aid junior Mathematics students and taught violin to children for three years. Lianne was named Dux of Rangitoto College in 2024 and amassed a truly remarkable amount of NCEA Excellence credits in her time at the school. She holds a Trinity College London Diploma in Violin performance and was selected for the KBB Music Festival Honours Programme.

Lianne's accolades include the Physics subject cup in Year 12, the Statistics subject cup in Year 13, and a Year 12 Leadership Award. She also competed in in the New Zealand Brain Bee Challenge, an international neuroscience competition.

In 2024 Jacob was named Mount Albert Grammar School Proxime Accessit and won an impressive set of school awards including first place in Economics, the Joseph Shaw Senior Chemistry Prize and the Bull Mathematics Prize.

As a member of the New Zealand Biology Olympiad Team, he earned a Bronze medal at the international competition in Armenia in 2022, and a Silver medal in the United Arab Emirates in 2023. He secured 1st place in the University of Auckland Engineering Science Competition in 2024 and was part of the team that placed 3rd in the New Zealand Senior Math Competition in 2023. He received an Honorable Mention as a New Zealand qualifier in the International Mathematical Modelling Challenge and earned a High Distinction in the New Zealand Economics Competition.

Jacob's extracurricular interests include playing table tennis, curling, and chess.

Jacob earned a Top Achiever Scholarship from the University of Auckland and is now studying a Bachelor of Science there, majoring in Mathematics and Statistics.

He served as an Academic Prefect and volunteered his time tutoring, coaching debating and contributing to STEM programs like STEAM-ED Robotics and the Rotary National Science & Technology Forum. A keen badminton player, Luca was selected for the Bay of Plenty regional team four years in a row.

His accolades include being awarded a Royal Society London International Youth Science Forum Scholarship in 2023, a Gold Medal in the New Zealand International Biology Olympiad, a Bronze Medal at the 2024 International Biology Olympiad in Kazakhstan, representing New Zealand at the 2024 World Schools Debating Championships in Serbia, Best Speaker at the 2024 New Zealand Schools Debating National Championships, and multiple VEX Robotics and Sheilah Winn Shakespeare National Festival awards.

Jifei was Deputy Head Girl and Dux (NCEA) at St Cuthbert's College, excelling across multiple disciplines. She represented New Zealand at the International Biology Olympiad, winning a Silver Medal in Kazakhstan in 2024 and a Bronze in 2023 in the UAE. She was awarded a Gold in the New Zealand Chemistry Olympiad and a Platinum Award in the New Zealand Biology Olympiad.

Beyond academics, she ranked 5th in Premier Advanced Auckland Debating and served as both a coach and adjudicator. She co-led SAGE, an initiative delivering STEM education via Zoom, and co-founded a fundraising initiative for the Starship Foundation.

A keen performer, Jifei was the Choir Leader of Saints Alive which received Gold at the Big Sing, and was a Runner-up in the National School Production at the Sheilah Winn Shakespeare Festival.
