Official Information Act Request

Thank you for your request under the Official Information Act 1982, partially transferred from the Ministry of Education to NZQA on 25 October 2023. NZQA is responding to parts 1 and 2 of your original request to the Ministry, i.e.:

- 1. Have students in realm nations piloted or attempted the NCEA co-requisite standards this year?
- 2. If so, can I please have a copy of the achievement rates and the resulting Assessment Report(s)?

Response

Students in realm nations attempted the NCEA co-requisite standards this year. Please refer to the attached spreadsheet *PRS-5203 Realm Country Pilots*. The data provided is from the Literacy & Numeracy | Te Reo Matatini me te Pāngarau assessment event in June 2023. There are no pilots this year.

Draft results for the October/November 2023 assessment event will not be available until late January.

Realm nation students participated in the June assessment event in the Reading (US32403), Writing (US32405), and Numeracy (US32406) standards - see 'Question 1 – Yes' tab in the spreadsheet. No realm nation students participated in te Pāngarau (US32412) nor te Reo Matatini (US32414) standards.

Achievement rates for these realm nation students can be found in tab 'Question 2'.

We have included the year level of participating students from realm nations. There is no year level restriction on entering for the NCEA co-requisite assessments.

Of the 242 participating students from the realm nations, 15% (36) were in Years 8 and Year 9 and 64% (156) were in Year 10. Nationally, only 4% of participating students in the June assessments were in Years 8 and 9 and 72% were in Year 10.

Note: Students have multiple opportunities through their secondary schooling years (and beyond) to achieve the new NCEA co-requisite standards.

We have not produced any specific assessment reports for realm nation students for the June 2023 Literacy & Numeracy | Te Reo Matatini me te Pāngarau assessment events.
