2018 NCEA and University Entrance Attainment Statistics

Purpose of Report

- 1. The final 2018 NCEA and University Entrance (UE) attainment statistics are now available. This report provides a high-level overview of these statistics, broken down by ethnicity, gender and decile, and comment on trends. Next steps for the release of the national statistics on 16 April 2019 are also discussed.
- 2. These statistics are still subject to further control checks prior to release on 16 April 2019.
- 3. The Ministry of Education (the Ministry) has been consulted on this briefing.

Background

- 4. You were provided with a briefing on 16 January 2019 outlining the provisional 2018 NCEA and University Entrance Attainment statistics¹. A further follow up briefing on findings from the Ministry and NZQA's investigation into the possible reasons for the decrease in Year 11 NCEA Level 1 attainment was provided to you on 1 March 2019 (METIS 1178051 refers).
- 5. These statistics are reported using the new enrolment-based measure of NCEA attainment. All attainment data going back to 2008 has been recast again for the final 16 April 2019 release as some adjustments had to be made to school-level reporting rules (principally the 70-day attendance rule start and end definitions). Due to the recast, both the 2018 data and the recast historical data show slight differences to that reported to you on 16 January 2019.
- 6. The statistics measure Year 11 Level 1, Year 12 Level 2, Year 13 Level 3 and Year 13 UE attainment. This is the typical NCEA attainment pathway for students however NCEAs are achieved in different patterns to this, e.g. NCEA Level 2 attainment over two years (Year 11 and Year 12), or NCEA Level 2 attainment by Year 13. NZQA and the Ministry are closely monitoring changes in the patterns of NCEA attainment by students.

Comment

Overall national attainment


- 7. The final 2018 attainment statistics are as follows:
 - a. 71.8% of Year 11 students attained NCEA Level 1 (43,033 of 59,941)
 - b. 77.4% of Year 12 students attained NCEA Level 2 (42,929 of 55,496)
 - c. 66.2% of Year 13 students attained NCEA Level 3 (31,849 of 48,082)
 - d. 49.1% of Year 13 students were awarded UE (23,615 of 48,082)
- 8. As anticipated, the final overall national attainment statistics have increased.2
- 9. The final 2018 attainment statistics show that 2018 Year 11 NCEA Level 1 attainment has decreased by 3.1 percentage points on 2017 figures. Year 11 NCEA Level 1

- attainment first dropped in 2017 (by 0.3 percentage points on 2016). This downward trend has amplified somewhat in 2018.
- 10. The 2018 Year 12 NCEA Level 2 attainment has also decreased on 2017 figures, by 0.9 percentage points.
- 11. Year 13 NCEA Level 3 has continued to increase, up by 1.2 percentage points on 2017 figures. Year 13 University Entrance is relatively steady, increasing slightly, by 0.6 percentage points.
- 12. Figure 1 below gives a ten-year view of NCEA and UE attainment percentages³.

13. Appendix 1 Tables 1 to 4 provide a more detailed breakdown of attainment for 2009 to 2018, including by ethnicity, gender and decile band.

Year 11 NCEA Level 1

14. The decline seen for the Year 11 NCEA Level 1 2018 attainment is reflected across the national statistics when broken down by decile band and by ethnicity, compared to the 2017 statistics. The percentage point drop is more pronounced for decile band 1 to 3 schools and for Māori and Pacific students than for higher decile schools and European and Asian students.

At the decile band

- a. A drop of 5.1 percentage points at Deciles 1-3 (58.1% 6,565 of 11,299)
- b. A drop of 3.5 percentage points at Deciles 4-7 (74.5% 19,301 of 25,924)
- c. A drop of 1.1 percentage points at Deciles 8-10 (80.6% 17,000 of 21,102)

By ethnicity

- a. A drop of 4.8 percentage points for Pacific students (62.1% 4,634 of 7,458)
- b. A drop of 4.8 percentage points for Māori students (57.9% 8,460 of 14,603)
- c. A drop of 3.0 percentage points for European students (77.3% 29,431 of 38,068)
- d. A drop of 0.5 percentage points for Asian students (76.4% 5,680 of 7,431)
- 15. Investigations into the decrease in attainment for Year 11 Level 1 show that there has been a change in the pattern of assessment toward fewer Level 1 credits being assessed in Year 11 as well as a decline in attainment of literacy and numeracy credits. However, as reported to you, no single factor was found to be underpinning this change (METIS 1178051 refers). NZQA's ongoing discussions with schools in March have not revealed any additional insights at this stage. Nationally, student retention is steady. The Ministry and NZQA will continue to monitor the Year 11 2018 cohort closely, from both a retention and an achievement perspective.

Other trends

- 16. The slight decline seen for the 2018 Year 12 NCEA Level 2 attainment is reflected across the national statistics when broken down by decile band and by ethnicity, compared to the 2017 statistics. It is slightly more pronounced for Decile band 1 to 3 schools, and for Māori and Pacific students.
- 17. The increases seen for Year 13 NCEA Level 3 and UE attainment are similarly reflected across the national statistics when broken down by decile band and by ethnicity, compared to the 2017 statistics with the exception of Year 13 UE attainment for Pacific (a decrease of 0.3 percentage points) and Year 13 UE attainment for decile band 8 to 10 (a decrease of 0.8 percentage points).
- 18. These trends will be closely monitored.

Next steps

- 19. Final national 2018 NCEA, UE and Scholarship attainment statistics will be made available on NZQA's website on 16 April 2019.
- 20. NZQA and the Ministry have developed key messages and expected questions and answers to support the release of the statistics. These address the trends in attainment for 2018, and information about the enrolment-based measure.
- 21. NZQA will be publishing a communication on the website to coincide with the publishing of the 2018 statistics.
- 22. NZQA and the Ministry will work together and with your office in managing any communications requirements.
- 23. NZQA will publish an Annual Report on NCEA and New Zealand Scholarship Data and Statistics at the end of May 2019. You will be provided with a briefing and a draft copy of the report by mid-May 2019.
