
The successful vendor for the marking solution, is RM Education Limited, and, for the delivery of the assessments, SoNET Systems Pty Limited. The significant phases of the NCEA Online procurement process to select the successful vendors are shown in table below:

Date	Activity
July 2015	NZQA commissioned a consulting report leading to establishment of "Procuring for Outcomes" approach
July 2016	Procuring for Digital Assessment Outcomes – Early Market Engagement launched with significant interest shown by 25 separate domestic and international suppliers.
April – July 2017	Design Exercise (creating prototypes of how the solution would work) with five shortlisted vendors from 25.
October 2017	Request for Proposal (RFP) developed and five vendors qualified to be invited to bid.
November– December 2017	RFP bids evaluated against project and task requirements and 2 vendors with complementary solutions selected to move to the Solution Design phase
March - October 2018	Solution Design phase
October 2018 – January 2019	Final negotiations for the agreements to build and then operate the finalised Solution Design taking place with each vendor

The names of unsuccessful vendors are withheld under section 9(2)(b)(ii) of the OIA, as it ... "would be likely unreasonably to prejudice the commercial position of the person who supplied or who is the subject of the information." NZQA is of the view that releasing the unsuccessful vendors names may damage their reputation.

NZQA is not aware of any public interest considerations outweighing the decision to withhold information under section 9 of the Act. NZQA considers it is in the public interest to attract tenders from a wide range of vendors, including those who expect their tender to be confidential.

As part of the commitment to open and transparent government, NZQA is proactively releasing responses to Official Information Act requests which are of public interest. NZQA intends publishing its response to your request on its website. Your name and contact details will be removed before publication.
