Provisional 2019 NCEA and University Entrance National Attainment Statistics

Purpose of Report

- 1. The provisional 2019 NCEA and University Entrance (UE) attainment statistics are now available. This report provides a high-level overview of these statistics, broken down by ethnicity, gender and decile.
- 2. The Ministry of Education has been consulted on this briefing.

Comment

3. The 2019 NCEA results were made available to students and schools on Tuesday 14 January 2020. 2019 provisional school attainment statistics will be made available to school Principals and Principal Nominees for their school (and including a decile band comparator in their Principal's report) on Thursday 16 January [CR19857 covering NZQA's data release schedule refers¹].

Overall attainment

- 4. The provisional NCEA attainment statistics are as follows:
 - 68.6% of Year 11 students attained NCEA Level 1 (41,819 of 60,996)
 - 76.1% of Year 12 students attained NCEA Level 2 (41,933 of 55,122)
 - 65.5% of Year 13 students attained NCEA Level 3 (30,314 of 46,279)
 - 46.8% of Year 13 students were awarded UE (21,645 of 46,279)




Figure 1: NCEA and University Entrance Attainment 2010-2019 (2019 Provisional)

5. Figure 1 below gives a ten-year view of NCEA and UE attainment. The 2010 to 2018 percentages are final, the 2019 percentages are provisional.

- 6. Based on patterns observed in previous years, these provisional overall national attainment statistics are likely to increase by one to two percentage points by the time attainment statistics are finalised in April 2020².
- 7. We expect the final 2019 attainment statistics to reach similar levels to 2018, with the exception of Year 11 NCEA Level 1 attainment. Year 11 NCEA Level 1 attainment first dropped in 2017 (by 0.3 percentage points), and then again in 2018 (by 2.6 percentage points). This downward trend is expected to continue, and it is expected that the 2019 Year 11 NCEA Level 1 attainment will be around two percentage points lower than the 2018 Year 11 NCEA Level 1 attainment when the attainment statistics are finalised in April 2020.
- 8. We have calculated an 'engagement in NCEA' indicator to better understand the lower Year 11 NCEA Level 1 attainment rate. The engagement indicator is the number of Year 11 students entered for 80+ credits³ divided by the number of Year 11 students enrolled at school. The engagement indicator for Year 11 students in Level 1 has been decreasing slightly over the last few years, from 85.8% in 2017 to 82.4% in 2019 (3.4 percentage points). By comparison, the engagement indicator for Year 12 students in Level 2 has decreased by 0.4 percentage points, and the engagement indicator for Year 13 students in Level 3 has increased by 1.7 percentage points.

 Over the next few weeks, we will be looking, by school, at changes in engagement by Year 11s in Level 1. NZQA's School Relationship Managers will liaise with identified schools to understand any school policy changes around NCEA Level 1 attainment for their year 11 students.

National attainment by ethnicity, gender and decile band

10. Appendix 1 Tables 1 to 4 provide a more detailed breakdown of attainment for 2010 to 2019, including by ethnicity, gender and decile band. The differences in attainment between 2018 and 2019 are reflected across the breakdowns by gender, decile band and ethnicity. The provisional results are not showing an improvement in attainment for Māori and Pacific students relative to other ethnicities.

Next steps

- 11. New Zealand Scholarship results will be released to students on Wednesday 5 February 2020.
- 12. Final 2019 NCEA, University Entrance and Scholarship attainment statistics will be made publicly available on NZQA's website on 28 April 2020. You will be provided with a briefing on the final statistics on 21 April 2019. NZQA will publish an Annual Report on NCEA and New Zealand Scholarship Data and Statistics at the end of May 2020. You will be provided with a briefing and a draft copy of the report by mid-May 2020.
