Official Information Act Request – Taratahi Agricultural Training Centre (Training Centre)

Thank you for your request received on 7 September 2020, under the Official Information Act 1982, for the following information:

- (a) The date on which the Training Centre/Training Farm first applied to NZQA to be registered as a private training establishment.
- (b) The date on which any such applications were first approved.
- (c) The dates on which re-registration may have occurred.
- (d) Confirmation of its status as at the time of liquidation.

NZQA is responding as the legislated quality assurance organisation for the non-university sector.

(a) Application for registration as a Private Training Establishment

Wairarapa Cadet Training Farm was a body corporate when it applied to NZQA to be registered as a private training establishment (PTE) on 2 April 1991. It also changed its name to Taratahi Agricultural Training Centre (Taratahi) at this time.

(b) The date on which applications were first approved

This application was reviewed by NZQA and was ultimately approved on 25 June 1991 for a period of three years.

(c) Dates of re-registration

Taratahi applied for and was approved re-registration as a PTE in 1994.

(d) Status at time of liquidation

This registration continued until voluntary cancellation of Taratahi's registration on 11 June 2019, when it went into liquidation.

Body Corporate:

The "Wairarapa Cadet Training Farm Act, 1969" is enclosed with the application. This describes in detail the terms of reference for the use of the 'Wairarapa Training Farm' which was ifted to the Crown in 1919. Under the terms of the Act the farm is administered on behalf of the Crown by a committee of Trustees in accordance with the terms of the trust. Under the terms of the Act the Trust Board is constituted a body corporate. At the time of the registration visit the documentation outlining the change of name to Taratahi Agricultural Centre was presented.

Goals and Purposes:

Goals and Purposes:

There is a mission statement and set of goals provided with the application which clearly sets out educational aims. There is a relationship with Wairarapa Polytechnic involving funding for staffing and equipment.

Underpinning the general goals are a set of values which focus on providing for equity of access and removal of barriers to completing a course of soudy (eg oral/written communication difficulties). Course evaluation processes communication difficulties). Course evaluation processes are also covered in the overall corporate plan, as is moderation of assessment by liaison and ensultation with other agricultural training centres.

Local Authority Approval:
The Wairarapa Training Farm Act as described above gives Crown approval to use the lands described in the schedule to the Act as a demonstration farm for teaching farm practice. This includes the buildings and property required for such teaching to occur. Under the terms of the Act the training farm is not to be sold or leased. To conclude, the Trust Board is declared to be a local authority under the Local Authorities Act 1968.

Staff:

A list of the staff, including non-teaching staff, is provided. The qualifications of the teaching staff are included, with full CV's also outlining experience.

Premises:

A general description of the premises is provided with the application. An inspection occurred at the visit,

and subsequently full diagrams of teaching areas were submitted.

Equipment:

Lists are supplied with the application for accreditation. The visit verified that the centre is well equipped for teaching.

Studet Information:

A folder of relevant information as supplied to students is provided in the application. It contains information on courses, fees, staff, scholarships available, the Trust Board, rules and regulations, associated farms, as well as an application form. Separate brochures are provided for each course.

Withdrawals and Refunds:

There is Apolicy on withdrawals aand refunds, giving 50% refund of the if withdrawal occurs within 4 weeks of commencement of course. The 7 day clause was explained at the time of the visit and since then the Trust Board has made a policy statement (enclosed with file) putting such a policy into place. It is to be published on course information from now on.

General standards of instruction: There is a clear indication, verified on the visit, that the criteria are being mer here with regard to specific learning outcomes, assessment methods, course evaluation, moderation.

RECOMMENDATION:

As a result of both the material sopplied with the application, and the visit to the contre on 11 June 1991, I recommend that the Taratahi Agricultural Training Centre be registered as a private training establishment for a period of three years.

Thank you for your letter of 28 September about extending approval and accreditation for the approval and accreditation for the courses offered by Taratahi Agricultural Training Centre.

NZQA now has in place a system of review rather than reregistration, reapproval and reaccreditation. For that reason has status held by an organisation remains in place until it is removed by NZQA. We have no intentions of doing so with Taratahi.

However, I realise that you may need confirmation of a new expiry date for other reasons. To accommodate your needs I have extended your organisation's approvals and accreditations until February 1995. This is done on the understanding that the existing courses will be transferred in unit standard format as a matter of priority.
