 - you must use a different number of strands for each whiri; this may include but is not limited to 3-flat, 4-round, 4-flat, 6-round, 6-flat whiri
 - you can include a mix of natural and synthetic materials or natural materials, for whiri 2 & 3
 - include specifications quality, quantities/number of strands, sizes
 - Include images of your processes
- 3. Ensure they are attached or bound to suit their intended purpose.
 - Include images of completed and attached or bound whiri.

Examples of complete whakamahi whiri may include but is not limited to:

- poi handles attached to poi,
- kete handles attached to kete,
- kete whiri base on kete whiri,
- taura for wearable garment on wearable garment,
- taonga whakapaipai on body,
- wrist band/bracelet on wrist,
- cordage or binding on Māori weaponry,
- cordage or binding for taonga pūoro
