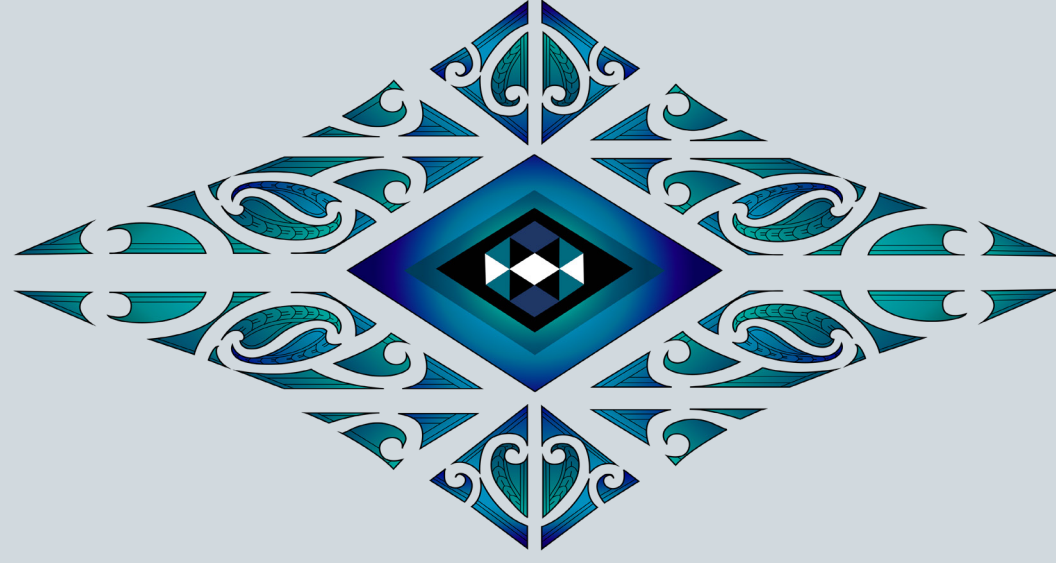


Programme Overview

Kōnae Ako	Kōnae Ako Overview
MANA REO	This kōnae ako provides ākonga with the opportunity to learn foundational level te reo Māori and apply to everyday tikanga Māori contexts.
TIKANGA MARAE	This kōnae ako introduces ākonga to protocols, roles and practices associated with hui (including pōwhiri) in accordance with tikanga and or kawa. Ākonga will also explain the use of karakia and waiata.
MANAAKI MARAE	This kōnae ako will enable ākonga to describe manaaki interactions in a wharekai, customary and traditional Māori kai as well as demonstrate knowledge and expressions of manaakitanga.
MANA WAHINE	This kōnae ako will enable ākonga to participate in and demonstrate knowledge of the preparation of a marae for a pōwhiri.
WAIATA MAI	This kōnae ako will enable ākonga to demonstrate knowledge and skills of waiata Māori including mōteatea and waiata ā-ringa.

Graduate Profile Outcomes

1. Describe the fundamental application of cultural concepts where tikanga are applied and practiced as an expression of mana ao tūroa.
2. Apply basic reo structures and tikanga practices as an expression of mana reo.
3. Apply basic factual knowledge to describe tikanga as they apply to kaitiakitanga in the expression of mana whenua.
4. Engage and interact with others to carry out basic aspects of tikanga as an expression of mana tangata.

WHAT IS TE MANAAKI TĀNGATA KI TE MARAE?

Māori Qualification Services (MQS) at NZQA, are the programme owner of a new Level 2 programme named Te Manaaki Tāngata ki te Marae.

This programme is intended to give ākonga fundamental knowledge of tikanga Māori principles and practices founded on the knowledge and mātauranga inherent within te ao Māori.

Whilst the programme has a specific focus on the marae, the cultural practices learnt are conducive to, creating understanding and awareness, enhancing learning, providing meaning and above all, applying tikanga respectfully.

Te Manaaki Tāngata ki te Marae contributes to NCEA (for kura) and on successful completion, ākonga can be awarded the following New Zealand qualification:

Tikanga Level 2 (60 credits).**
