In your answer, you should:

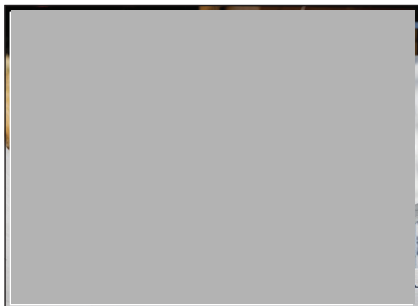
- identify your chosen option

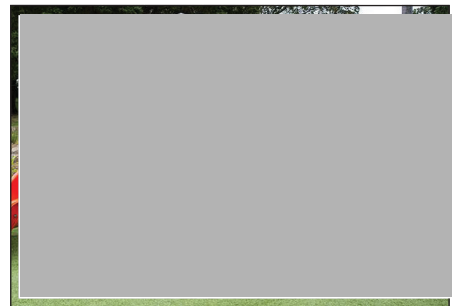

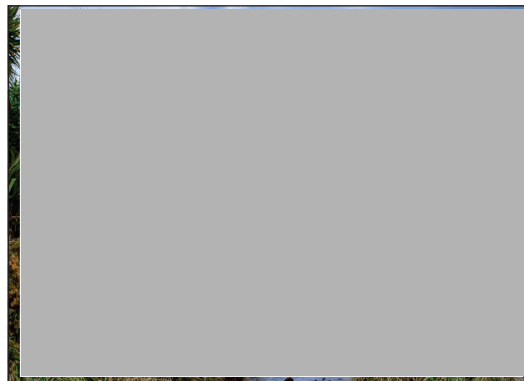
