Candidates will be required to write an essay on at least one text. A range of questions covering all written text types will be provided, from which candidates will select ONE to answer.

Candidates are encouraged to write a concise response of no more than 800–900 words (5–6 pages). Assessment will be based on the quality of the response rather than its length.

oral text(s), supported by evidence

Version: 1

Number of credits: 4

Candidates will be required to write an essay on at least one text. A range of questions covering visual and oral text types will be provided, from which candidates will select ONE to answer.

Candidates are encouraged to write a concise response of no more than 800–900 words (5–6 pages). Assessment will be based on the quality of the response rather than its length.

Title: Respond critically to significant aspects of unfamiliar written

texts through close reading, supported by evidence

Version: 1

Number of credits: 4

Candidates will be required to respond to questions on one prose and one poetry text. Questions one and two will focus on each text individually and question three will focus on a comparison of both texts.
