## Specific information for individual achievement standards

<b>Standard:</b>	91231
<b>Title:</b>	Examine sources of an historical event that is of significance to New Zealanders
<b>Version:</b>	2
<b>Number of credits:</b>	4

A variety of sources and concepts, as listed in the explanatory notes of the standard, will be used to assess historical skills.

Candidates will be required to write paragraph-length answers.

Candidates will be provided with a resource booklet containing a variety of historical sources, primary and secondary.

The context provided will be **kotahitanga movements in Aotearoa New Zealand from the nineteenth century to the present day**.

<b>Title:</b>	Examine causes and consequences of a significant historical event
<b>Version:</b>	2
<b>Number of credits:</b>	5

Candidates will be required to write an essay on ONE significant historical event they have studied, using a conventional essay format.

One general essay question will be provided.

Candidates will be expected to provide a brief paragraph describing the context of the significant historical event and to examine a limited number of causes OR consequences (or both) of their chosen historical context.

There is no prescribed content.

Candidates are encouraged to write a concise response of no more than 750–800 words (4–5 pages).

<b>Title:</b>	Examine how a significant historical event affected New Zealand society
<b>Version:</b>	2
<b>Number of credits:</b>	5

Candidates will be required to write an essay on ONE significant historical event they have studied, using a conventional essay format.

One general essay question will be provided.

Candidates will be expected to provide a brief paragraph describing the context of the significant historical event and to examine how the event affected people in New Zealand society, including the social, political, and / or economic effects.

There is no prescribed content.

Candidates are encouraged to write a concise response of no more than 750–800 words (4–5 pages).
