The assessments will each consist of THREE questions written in English and Cook Islands Māori based on the texts provided.

Text choices for both standards will reflect appropriate cultural contexts, for example Cook Islands Māori-speaking communities, te ao Māori, the Pacific, and Aotearoa New Zealand. Texts will refer to events or experiences on familiar matters.

In Level 2 Cook Islands Māori examinations, candidates can respond in Cook Islands Māori, English, or te reo Māori o Aotearoa.

Digital examination

Listening passages will be available online as audio files.

Candidates will be able to listen and respond to recordings of three spoken texts, which they can hear as a whole and twice in sections. They can choose when to start each play but cannot pause inside each play. Candidates will require headphones to listen.

Listening notes spaces are available inside the digital examination.

Paper-based examination

Candidates will listen and respond to recordings of three spoken texts, which they will hear as a whole and twice in sections. Candidates may make notes in the listening notes spaces provided.

The total duration of the recordings will be up to 45 minutes.
