Candidates will be provided with a resource booklet containing a variety of historical sources, primary and secondary. Resources will NOT be released prior to the exam.

Candidates will be required to demonstrate an understanding of ONE specified historical concept in the context of the resource material provided.

Candidates will also be required to demonstrate an understanding of TWO historical concepts in a familiar (studied) context. Candidates must use evidence other than that provided in the resource booklet in their response about their studied context.

The concepts will be specified from the list below:

- mana
- whakapapa
- tūrangawaewae
- cause
- effect.

The assessment will consist of a single question with multiple parts, each requiring paragraph responses.
