

## Māori Performing Arts and Mau Rākau Guide to Remote Assessment

*In response to the impacts of COVID-19 on assessment for Māori Performing Arts and Mau Rākau, this provides guidance for assessment of the levels 1, 2, 3 and 4 standards of these subjects.*

### *Assessing performance*

The following table lists Māori Performing Arts and Mau Rākau standards that require demonstration or performance.

The Mau Rākau Level 1 and Māori Performing Arts Level 1 and 2 standards are intended for learners who are new to performance. Learners must demonstrate the essential skills or basic performance competencies to achieve at these levels. For Level 3 and 4 standards, learners are required to perform with competency. Refer to the standards for further information. Assessors are reminded to check that they have consent to assess the level 4 standards.

While Schools may assess their learners in a group setting for the Māori Performing Arts and Mau Rākau standards, learners must also demonstrate individual competence. Refer to the standards for further information.

### *Gathering evidence remotely*

All these standards require assessment evidence of a demonstration or performance. To provide performance evidence where students are learning remotely, they need access to:

- an appropriate space to demonstrate or perform
- a recording device ie, camera and or phone with recording capability
- someone to record their demonstration and/or performance, and
- access to the internet to upload and send video evidence to.

Guidelines are needed to ensure the camera operator does not edit or zoom in, and to make sure the whole body is in view. It is recommended that a draft performance is recorded to confirm the performance work is visible and audible.

These evidence requirements may pose issues with regard to access and equity for some students which you will need to consider in your programme planning.

Assessors are reminded that learners may, in addition to recording the demonstration or performance, submit a recording of them providing the rangahau (research) outcome of the standards.

### *Performance Assessment opportunities in 2020*

Assessors may use footage of learner performance from senior regional kapahaka competitions as evidence for:

- Māori Performing Arts level 3 standard
- Outcome 2 of the level 2 and 4 Māori Performing Arts standards.

Footage may also be used as evidence for the Mau Rākau standards provided assessors ensure that there is sufficiency of the relevant evidence requirements.
