Anaphora is a technique used to bind successive clauses together using the repetition of a word or phrase at the beginning of the clauses. Virgil achieves this with the repetition of <u>ter</u> – three times, (2) when Aeneas tries three times to embrace the ghost of his wife Creusa and is three times unsuccessful. This repetition demonstrates Aeneas' desperation (3) and indicates that his old life is over (4.)
