(1) Musical Composition - Video.

(2) Tempo

The speed of a piece of music that is played or pace.

- (5) The musical composition I have put together moves at a slow pace, this is because I want everyone who listens to it to understand that it is supposed to be soothing and sorrowful music.
- (6) It should give the audience a sense of sadness but also calmness to ease their pain.

(3) Rhythm

A strong, regular repeated pattern of movement or sound or voice which dictates the style of performance.

- (5) The rhythm of my piece is very slow and quiet at the beginning to set a scene of grief and unknowingness,
- (6) then moves into a medium rhythm to capture the essence of regaining strength, hope and for what lies ahead.

(4) Dynamics

Refers to the VOLUME, ENERGY, FLOW and SPEED of a performance, interaction between the performers which portrays the mood or atmosphere in the piece.

- (5) In my piece, I start slow with low volume. I build the volume up, strumming harder as I approach the chorus. I don't want to leave the listeners in a state of somber or sad mood. So I have made the bridge with a change of chords to lighten the mood. I have used open chords to change the sound during my piece, which gives it an emotional ambience and helps the audience 'feel' a part of the journey.
- (6) Also, I have incorporated slight presses on specific chords to keep the audience engaged and their ears attentive to the piece of composition.
