1.	<p>For Excellence, the ākonga is required to express three categories within a discipline of Te Ao Haka.</p> <p>This involves demonstrating storytelling and technical proficiency appropriate to the style of each category through the performance, and executing a performance with ihi, wehi, and wana.</p> <p>Te Ao Haka 3.2 Activity B (NCEA Website)</p> <p>Exemplar A He haka mau rākau (wā: 5.45 – 7.10) He haka taparahi (wā: 19.45 – 22.14) He haka whakatūwaewae (wā: 23.37 – 24.36)</p> <p>The male ākonga (centre, front row in Haka Taparahi) was assessed for this exemplar.</p>



	Grade: Merit
2.	<p>For Merit, the ākonga is required to communicate three categories within a discipline of Te Ao Haka.</p> <p>This involves conveying the kaupapa of the three items through the performance and giving meaning to each category through appropriate expression.</p> <p>Te Ao Haka 3.2 Activity A (NCEA Website)</p> <p>Exemplar A Tahi Rua Toru</p> <p>The ākonga (centre) was assessed for this exemplar.</p> <p>Te Ao Haka 3.2 Activity A (NCEA Website)</p> <p>Exemplar B Te Umutaoroa Taku rakau e E tama e</p> <p>The ākonga (2nd in stage right) was assessed for this exemplar.</p>



	Grade: Achieved
3.	<p>For Achieved, the ākonga is required to perform three categories within a discipline of Te Ao Haka.</p> <p>This involves the ākonga performing three items within the same discipline making a clear difference between the categories with precision.
