Te Wāhanga 1: He Tirohanga Whānui

Kia āta whakaritea ngā ākonga i mua i te *Rā Aromatawai ā-Waho*, ko te painga atu tērā. Kia rite mai te ākonga ki te kawe i te Kete-Manarua, mā te whakawai, mā te āta wānanga ano hoki ka eke te taunakitanga o ngā mahi hei whakaahua mo te iwi.

Te Wāhanga 2: He kōrero mō te Paerewa

91978: Te whakaatu māramatanga ki ētahi wāhanga o roto o Te Ao Haka

Te Aromatawai ā-Waho:

E rua ngā wāhanga o te Tūmahī Aromatawai nei:

- a) He whakaaturanga mō ngā wāhanga poi e RUA, ngā wāhanga haka e RUA rānei.

Ka taea e te Ākonga te whakamahi i ngā tūngā i tū ai ia mai i te tau 2023 – 2024, ahakoa tōna momo. Ka taea hoki e te tauira te rikoata ko ia me tōna kotahi, ko ia me ētahi atu rānei mō te pūtake o te aromatawai nei, heoi, e whakaae hoki ana kia whakamahi i ngā tūngā whakataetae ā rohe, ā motu, Ahurei me Te Matatini i tū ai ia.

Kaua e roa ake i te toru miniti ki ia wāhanga, kaua hoki e iti iho i te 2 miniti ki ia wāhanga.

Hei whakamōhiotanga atu, mō ngā tūngā e rua, me rerekē ngā pekanga ēngari me ūrite te wāhanga, hei tauira:

- Poi: Tūnga 1 – Kia rua ngā poi poto
Tūnga 2 – Kia rua ngā poi waeroa
- Haka: Tūnga 1 – Haka Taparahi
Tūnga 2 – Ngeri

- b) He wāhanga whakamārama i ia Wāhanga Poi, Haka rānei, he Whakatakoto hoki i ētehi ritenga, i ētehi rerekētanga anō kei ia Wāhanga Poi, Haka rānei.

He wāhanga hei whakamārama i te Poi/Haka, tōna kaitito, nō whea taua kaitito, te taua hoki i titoa ai taua Poi/Haka.

He whakamārama i te momo o te Poi/Haka, me ngā ritenga/rerekētanga ki te Poi/Haka tuarua e mahi nā koe.

Te Tirohanga:

Kia manawatahi te āhuatanga reo o Te Ao Haka, hei Tauira, Ngā Pekanga. Kia hāngai, kia tika hoki ngā reo o te aromatawai kia rite tonu ki te wāhanga kuputaka o Te Ao Haka. Ka mutu, he akiaki mō te taha ki ngā whakautu/taunaki a ngā ākonga kia whai i ngā tukanga o ngā Tautuhinga.

- i waiwai ana anō ngā whakaaturanga e rua mō ngā wāhanga pekanga o Te Ao Haka i kōwhirihia e te ākonga.

Ko ngā Ākonga **Kāore i whiwhi** i te paerewa paetae nei:

- i ngana te ākonga ki te whakatakoto mai he kōrero mō ngā wāhanga Te Ao Haka, heoi, kāre e maha ūna taunakitanga.

91979: Te whakaatu māramatanga ki ngā huānga o roto i tētahi whakaaturanga o Te Ao Haka

Te Aromatawai ā-Waho:

E hāngai ana te whakamātauau Kete Manarua nei ki ngā whakataetae o Te Matatini mai i te tau 2000 (ki Tūrangawaewae) Te Matatini mai i te tau 2002 (ki Takaparawha) me Te Matatini mai i te tau 2005 (ki Rangitāne). Ka noho ko te horopaki o tēnei kaupapa hei wherawhera, hei whakamārama, hei whakamahī me te whakatauira mōhiotanga o ngā Kaupapa nō roto mai o Te Ao Haka i tēnei tāpaetanga. Kei runga ipurangi Ūtupa ngā whitiata o ēnei Matatini e toru.

1. Me whiriwhiri te tauira kia RUA ngā Kapa Haka o ngā Matatini e toru. Me whakatau i roto i te aromatawai nei ko wai mā aua Kapa Haka e rua, ka mutu, mehemea he rauemi, he kiriata, he pikitia rānei ka whakamahia, me whai hoki ngā tohutoro e tika ana mōna.
2. Me tuku e te tauira tētehi WHAKAATURANGA e whakamārama ana i Ngā Kaupapa i kitea, i rangona i roto i tētehi Tūmomo nō ngā Kapa Haka e rua. Me kotahi te pekanga nō ia Kapa hei whakamahī, hei whakamārama anō e te tauira (hei tauira, Te Waka Huia 2000 – Whakaekē, Waihīrere 2002 – Whakaekē).
3. Me mārama ki te kaiarotake ko wai ngā Kapa Haka e rua me ngā Tūmomo e rua ka whakamahia e te tauira.
4. Me tīpako hoki te tauira Ngā Kaupapa nō te rārangi Kaupapa kei tēnei aromatawai. (He mea kōwhiri kia RIMA ngā Kaupapa hei kaupapa matapaki māu i tō whakaaturanga).

Section 1: Commentary

It is crucial to adequately prepare candidates prior to the *External Assessment Date*. Candidates' readiness for the Kete Manrua relies on sufficient learning time and gathering of evidence to practice and deliver.

Section 2: Report on the standards

91978: Demonstrate understanding of categories within Te Ao Haka

The External Assessment:

This submission task requires students to submit a performance that demonstrates understanding of categories within a Te Ao Haka discipline. Students will choose TWO categories from the same discipline to perform and explain.

Assessment Format - The pieces of work will fall under two tasks:

- a) A performance of TWO Poi or TWO Haka categories.

Students can use performance recordings that they were involved in between the years 2023 – 2024. Students are also able to record themselves with or without others for the purpose of this assessment, and performances from any Regional, National, Ahurei or Te Matatini competitions are accepted.

The recordings should be no longer than 3 minutes for each performance, and no less than 2 minutes for each.

Note: The two performances must be different categories but of the same discipline, for example:

- Poi: Performance 1 – Double Short Poi
Performance 2 – Double Long Poi
- Haka: Performance 1 – Haka Taparahi
Performance 2 - Ngeri

b) A presentation explaining each Poi or Haka and demonstrating understanding of similarities and differences between each category.

A presentation consisting of information about the Poi or Haka they have chosen, the composer, where the composer is from and the year it was composed.

An explanation of the type of Poi or Haka and how the similarities and differences with the second Poi or Haka.

Observations:

Te Ao Haka language features need to be consistent throughout, e.g. discipline or item. Ensuring that kupu and language that is used in the Te Ao Haka Glossary need to also be utilised within the Assessment and responses. An admonition for student responses/evidence submitted, that all work aligns to the assessment specifications.

Report on the Achievement Standard:

91979: Demonstrate understanding of elements within a Te Ao Haka performance

The External Assessment:

This Submission assessment task looked to the Te Matatini Competitions from the year 2000 (held at Tūrangawaewae) Te Matatini from the year 2002 (held at Takaparawha) and Te Matatini from the year 2005 (held at Rangitāne). These resources and materials will be the context in which the students will explore, implement and demonstrate understanding of elements within Te Ao Haka in this submission. Performances from the three Te Matatini years are available on YouTube for students to select.

1. Students are to select TWO different Kapa Haka performance items from any of the three Te Matatini competitions.
2. Students will submit a PRESENTATION that explains the elements that have been used in the performances from the chosen Kapa Haka. . Students are free to choose any one discipline from each Kapa Haka. (For example, Te Waka Huia 2000 - Whakaeke, Waihīrere 2002 - Whakaeke).
3. Students must stipulate which Kapa they are referring to and which discipline they are using.
4. FIVE Elements must be explained in the presentation. Students will only choose Elements from the list provided below.

Observations:

Te Ao Haka language features need to be consistent throughout. e.g. discipline/item. Ensure language/words that are utilised within the Assessment are also written in the subject glossary for Te Ao Haka. Lastly, an admonition for student responses/evidence submitted, that all work aligns to the assessment specifications.
