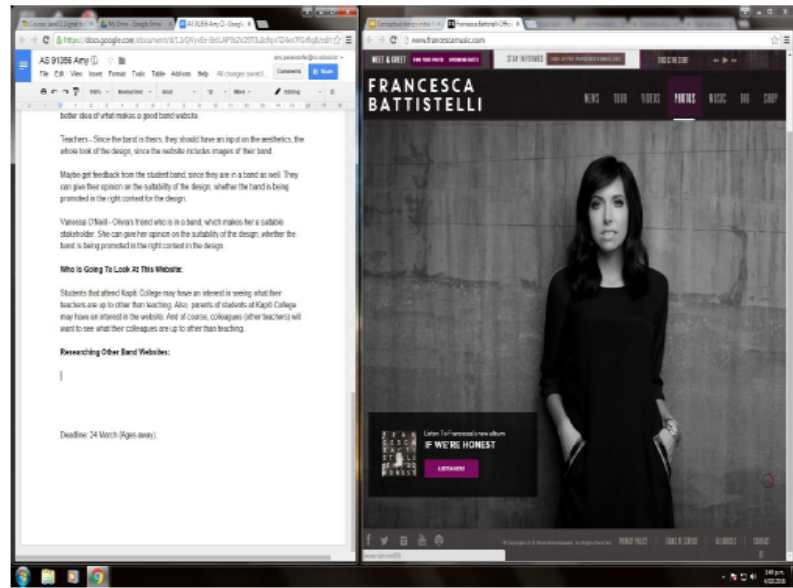

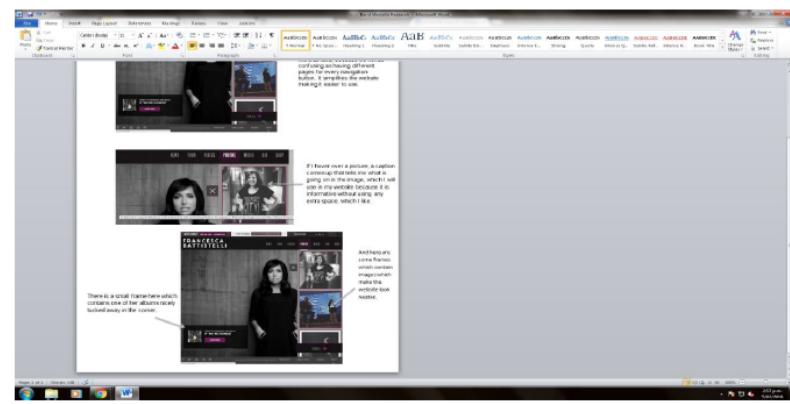

1.	<p>For Excellence, the student needs to develop a justified conceptual design for an outcome.</p> <p>This involves:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • synthesising evidence from ongoing research and functional modelling, including feedback from stakeholders, to evaluate conceptual designs • substantiating the outcome’s potential fitness for purpose. <p>This student has created a conceptual design for a school band website.</p> <p>The student has researched other related websites and drawn conclusions as to how that will inform the conceptual design (1) (2). The student generated a mood board and low fidelity wireframes as initial concepts and has used stakeholder feedback to select design ideas for the conceptual designs (3) (4).</p> <p>High fidelity wireframes that showed alternative design layouts and features were created during the design development (the homepage of only one development design is shown). This involved exploring additional design features through ongoing research, trialling high fidelity wireframes and evaluating their fitness for purpose (not shown). Stakeholder feedback was embedded throughout this process to select suitable design features for the final design (5).</p> <p>A final annotated conceptual design for the website (6), including all the pages (not shown) has been produced.</p> <p>The student begins to synthesize stakeholder feedback and wireframe designs to draw conclusions (2) (3) (4) (5) (6).</p> <p>For a more secure Excellence, the student could further support selected design ideas and/or conceptual designs by making reference to research, results from modelling and stakeholder feedback to justify the outcome’s fitness for purpose.</p>

The website has relevant images of the singer, I will also use relevant images to the band. And up top, if you hover over one of the navigation buttons, the button is highlighted, using the purple colour from the ongoing colour scheme of purple, black and a variety of grey shades, that way the user knows what they are hovering over, and it looks nice. I think I will do something similar using my colour scheme of the College colours, because I think colour schemes unify the website together nicely. The whole look of the website is modern, because the website uses modern techniques to promote this singer. I will also use a modern style, since it applies most to what the teachers band has to offer and suits the style of the present.



Relevant sizing of the text, it changes according to the size of the window, which I want to use in my website because it makes the website more universal.

The colours are shades of grey and black with some purple bits in it to make it more interesting. The font is nice and simple and readable. The simplicity of the font is nice, because that way, the font doesn't take attention away from the nice images that are being displayed. The singers name is written in white to make it stand out more from the grey font of the navigation buttons, and vice versa. The grey font contrasts less against the background colour which makes it more pleasing to the eye. I will use a similar approach because I think it is an effective design aspect. (But using my own colour scheme).

Student A:

What do you think of the colours for moodboard one, and what could be improved:
 I really like the colour scheme - the selection of colours work together really well, and suit the photos selected. I would say make one colour the colour used the most - that way you can use the other colours as accent colours, helping the more important elements to stand out to the user.

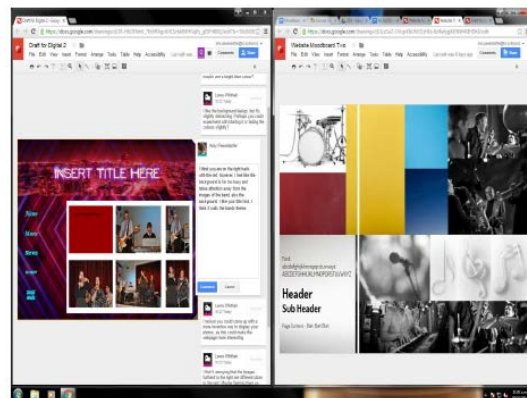
What do you think of the font for moodboard one, and what could be improved:
 The font is suitable for the header, and works with the colours, but I believe a different font could be used for the page content - something more basic, like Arial, as it's easier to read in large quantities.

What do you think of the colours for moodboard two, and what could be improved:
 Although I prefer the more vibrant sky blue in the second one, overall I preferred the colour scheme of the first moodboard. In the second one the light blue is vibrant, but the rest of the

colours aren't, and thus I feel like they don't work as well together. If you made all the colours a bit brighter, then this colour scheme could really work. Also, the idea that the page is in colour and the photos are in black and white is a good idea, but you'll need to be careful putting it together - if done wrong it could result in the background distracting the user from the photos.

What do you think of the font for moodboard two, and what could be improved:
 I prefer this font for the content text, but preferred the font in moodboard 1 for the headings. Perhaps if you used both in different places (font 1 for the headers, font 2 for the bodies of text).

Which moodboard is your favourite and why:
 The first one - I like the bolder colours and bolder designs. I also prefer the font - the one in the second moodboard reminds me of Comic Sans for some reason.



MoodBoard Conclusion:

Two people liked the first moodboard and two people liked the second moodboard, but I think I will go with the second one because it was Mr. [redacted] favourite, and he is in the teacher's band therefore his opinion is more relevant. He gave me very good feedback on what kind of mood the band actually is; more rocky less chamber music.

Feedback For MoodBoard Two:

Plus: The black and white it looks really sleek and nice. The font is good because it's bold and stands out nicely. The several patches of colours on the second mood board are a little dull but they fit together nicely. Font is fine - simple is good. The idea that the page is in colour and the photos are in black and white is a good idea, but I need to be careful putting it together - if done wrong it could result in the background distracting the user from the photos.
Possible Improvements: Maybe have an eye popping colour for the writing to make it stand out more, otherwise if you have white or black it might clash with the black and white images. The second mood board has a less variety of colour but has a larger impact of music. The black and white pictures however will be overpowered by the colours and so maybe the colours should be more subtle. The header and subheader on the second moodboard are very common, this could be changed to a more unique font type to make it more of its own. In the second one the light blue is vibrant, but the rest of the colours aren't, and thus they don't work as well together. If I made all the colours a bit brighter, then this colour scheme could really work. The second moodboard font for the content text is good, but the font in moodboard 1 is nicer for the headings. Perhaps if I used both in different places (font 1 for the headers, font 2 for the bodies of text).

Student A:

What do you think of the layout for Design One and what could be improved:
I would like the title to be in the middle - it would fill the empty space and grab my attention more.
I like how all the text is at the bottom because the images and video thumbnails are more interesting to glance over.
The fact that the whole website is split into multiple columns makes it look more cluttered in my opinion.
I like the idea of the individual scrollable frames, but perhaps having two is a bit too much and could confuse the viewer, especially when they're side by side without a gap in between.

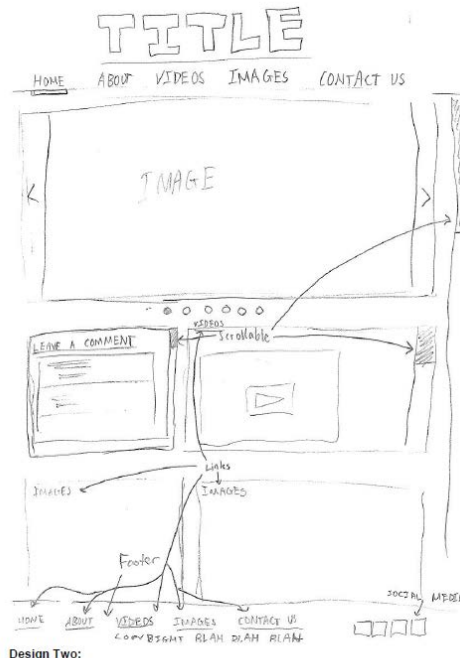
What do you think of the layout for Design Two and what could be improved:
I like the logo in the middle, and having a second navigation bar at the bottom of the page makes navigation far more convenient. Again, if you want to have multiple scrollable frames, having two frames with scrollbars side by side would confuse me, and I'd probably attempt to use the wrong scrollbar.

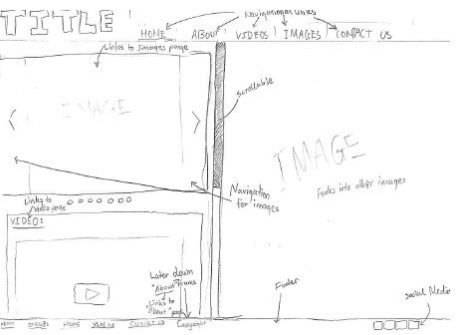
What do you think of the layout for Design Three and what could be improved:
I like this layout - it's unique and thus gets my attention. However, I feel like you don't need an image slideshow *and* a large image to the right - perhaps just have the image slideshow to the right and go straight into some text, seeing as you've got the images already. I feel like the logo should be in the middle, as being to the left and having a very large image, it's lost and I would miss it.

What do you think of the layout for Design Four and what could be improved:
This one feels cluttered - if you spaced each frame apart more it wouldn't feel as cramped in as it does. I feel like in this one, you could have a slideshow for videos instead of a scrollable frame, but keep the scrollable frame for the "about" frame. I feel like the image slideshow should be above the videos and about, as it would immediately grab my attention.
The second navigation bar looks a bit small - I feel like it should be more similar in size to the top navigation bar. Social media links could perhaps be bigger, making them easier to find.

Design 4: I like how simple the frame layout is, and the interactive elements - they just need to be modified a bit.

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Feedback For Hand Drawn Designs:

Favourite Designs: Mainly Three And Two.

Plus For Design Two:
The second design layout is similar to the first one however this time it is more spread out and comfortable. The layout is nicely spread out compared to the first design. The layout for this one is better because it all flows nicely together and there are no chunks of space. The logo in the middle is nice, and having a second navigation bar at the bottom of the page makes navigation far more convenient. Also, it is nice how on this version the page splits into multiple columns after an image slideshow, as it means the image is the only thing to initially grab the user's attention, and nothing else is competing with it.

Minus For Design Two:
The bottom layer of the page is again very busy and a lot is going on. Maybe I could lessen the amount of frames on the page and have more free space and a dominant picture of the band on the background. If you have the image slideshow, I don't need two image frames below - one would be sufficient. If I want to have multiple scrollable frames, having two frames with scrollbars side by side would confuse the user, and the user would probably attempt to use the wrong scrollbar.

Plus For Design Three: This layout is good - it's unique and thus gets the user's attention.

Minus For Design Three:
Again like the last two designs, there is very little space where you can see the background. On most pages that have been evaluated, the band has an image of themselves in the background with dominant presence. This one isn't as good as the others because it's very busy looking and just too much to take in. However, you don't need an image slideshow *and* a large image to the right - perhaps just have the image slideshow to the right and go straight into some text, seeing as I have got the images already. The logo should be in the middle, as being to the left and having a very large image, it's lost and the user would miss it.

Favourite two Designs and why:
The second and the third one because they have a more 'relaxed' and attractive layout. The first and the last one are very similar and are too busy and crowded. Design Two and Design Three. Design 4: Simple frame layout - and the interactive elements - they just need to be modified a bit. Design Two is good because the page doesn't have too much on it, and each bit is scrollable. The buttons at the top are also at the bottom which is nice.

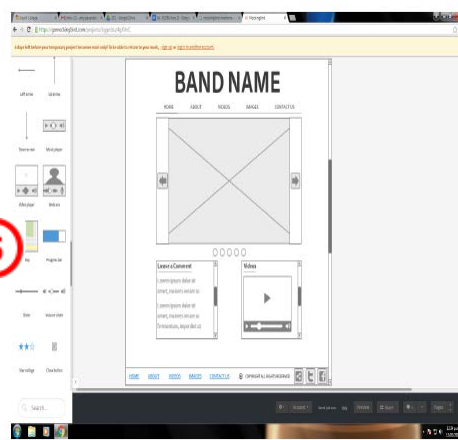
Student A:

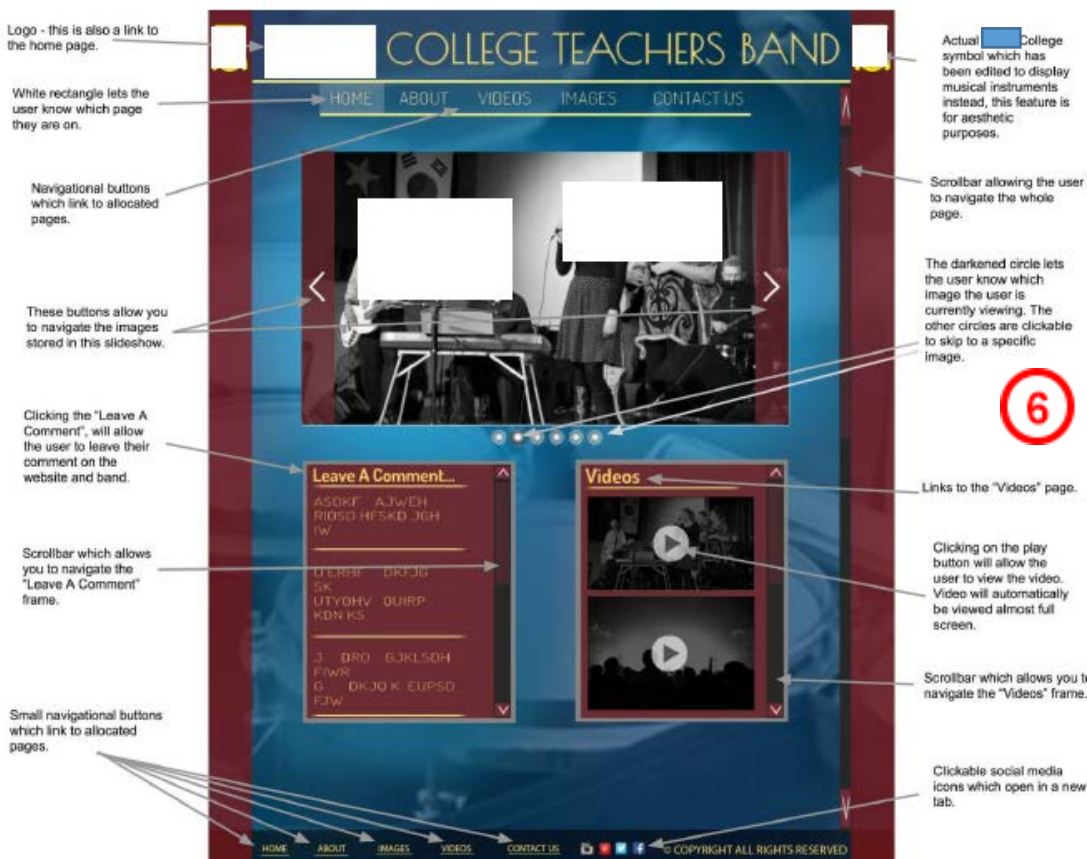
Minus For Wireframe One:

Plus For Wireframe One:
The layout of this one is nice. It is not busy but has enough characteristics and aspects for it to be balanced. The usage of frames is also equally balanced and this gives a better feel of unity for the page. This layout looks really good. How you can leave a comment is a good idea. It's simple while still having many interactive elements. The fact that everything is clearly spaced out is nice - **the scrollbars in the two frames are much clearer now.**

Minus For Wireframe Two:
The second layout is good however the image on the right is really out of proportion and this is a little bit too dominant in the layout. This one is more crowded and squished together it doesn't look as tidy and neat **maybe make the page bigger?** This one is clear, but something about the layout looks messier than the first one. The extra spacing makes it easier to navigate, **but the fact that it's more landscape than portrait makes it a bit hard on the eyes.**

Plus For Wireframe Two:
If the image is made smaller and more balanced to the others this would be a great design.

Favourites and Improvements:
The first one, **the second layout is a little overwhelming**, the first one is far more balanced, the frames are varied but due to the unity of the frames it mixed together like bread with butter. Wireframe One because the layout is better and **the idea of leaving a comment is good.** Wireframe 1 - simple, interactive, clear and clean layout. **Also, its portrait, compared to the second one which looks messier because its landscape.** Prefer design one - it is good that both are uncluttered. Kind of a stark beauty to both. **I like the Band name in the middle of the top - completely unambiguous as to what the page is about, and that the frames are self-contained with side arrows and scroll bars. The buttons top and bottom are pretty idiot-proof too.**



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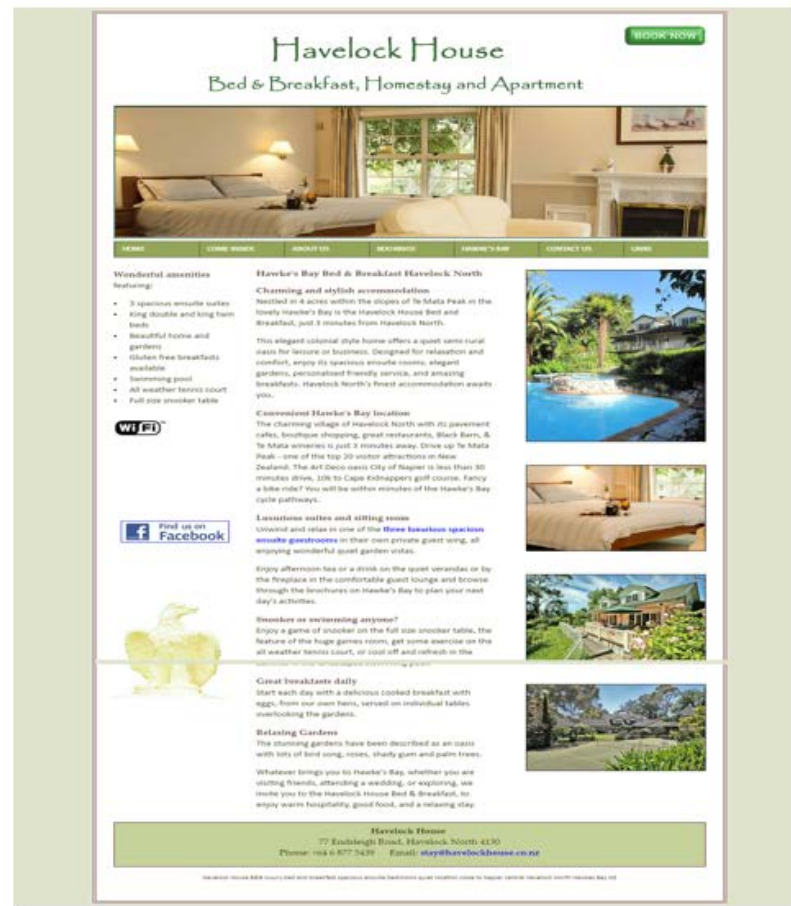
Physical Environment: Where will it be used?

On the internet, maybe linked to MySC, since it is relevant to things going on in School College. It will be used where people interested in the website can access it easily.

I think if I link it to MySC, more people from SC will look at the website because it is there and easy to access. If this website was to be used on the internet, I would have to find a good web hosting service so that it is reliable and appropriate, also, it would have to be a good web hosting service so that dodgy ads can be avoided (web hosting: the activity or business of providing storage space and access for websites). For a good web hosting service, you need to pay more money, therefore, if you are going to have ads on the website to pay off the fee, at least make them appropriate for all ages at School College. The images used in the website shouldn't be too big, or they would take a while to load, which is not what you want if you want to navigate with ease through the website. The website should also not be too graphic heavy as it will affect the loading speed. The website should have an appropriate relevant sizing much like Francesca Battistelli's website where everything just gets a bit smaller, not like the X Ambassadors', where the relevant sizing hides the navigation bar so that it is harder to navigate the website. The website should look and function the same on different browsers such as Chrome, Safari, Mozilla Firefox and Internet Explorer (To be honest, why would you use Internet Explorer). If the website is compatible with different devices and different browsers, the website becomes easier to use and the website becomes more universal and easier to access.

Attributes of existing websites



Positives

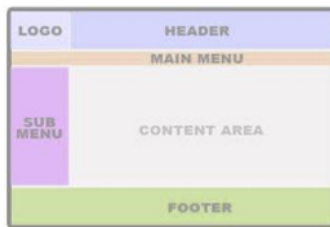
- The "Book Now" button is too vibrant. This is due to it being a different shade of green to the rest of the page. It stands out from the title which should be the main focus. Because it placed beside the title, it distracts from the "warmness" of the page becomes off-putting.
- The links are a bright blue colour which distracts from the calming colours. It makes the page look old.
- There is a random picture of an eagle which has no significance to the website.
- Headings are too small and need to be bolder.
- The links on the left side of page are strangely spread out. They should all be close together. It makes the page messy.

Implication

- The navigation bar worked out perfectly. It was neatly spread out, giving it a crisp and clean feel. It matched the colour scheme. This would be greatly considered for the B&B webpage.
- The colour scheme worked well, no colours clashed with each other so it did not feel full on. Green is also a very calming colour so it gave the page a warm feeling.

Website Layouts

I have chosen 4 layout ideas which I can then develop on. I will draw up 2 concepts based on these layout designs which I will present to my client, then they can make the final decision.

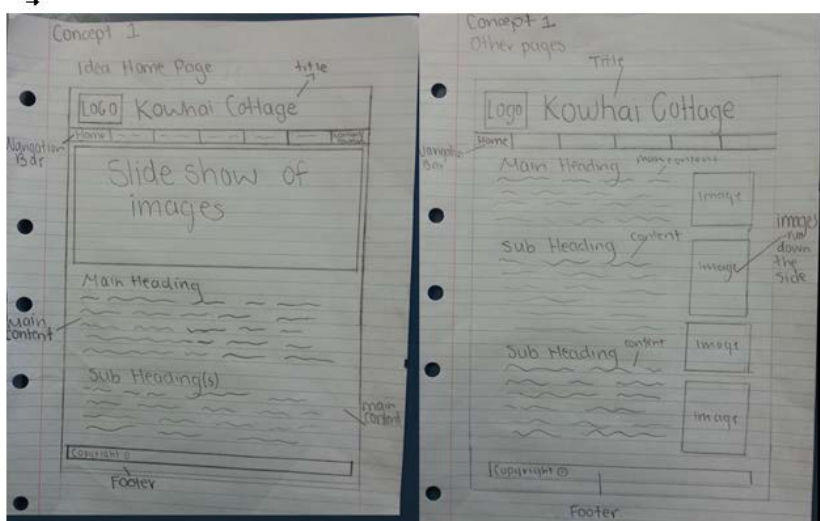

Concept 1



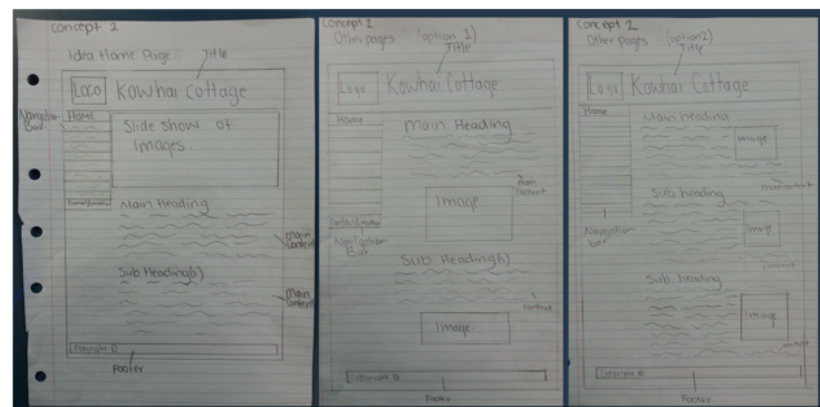

Concept 2

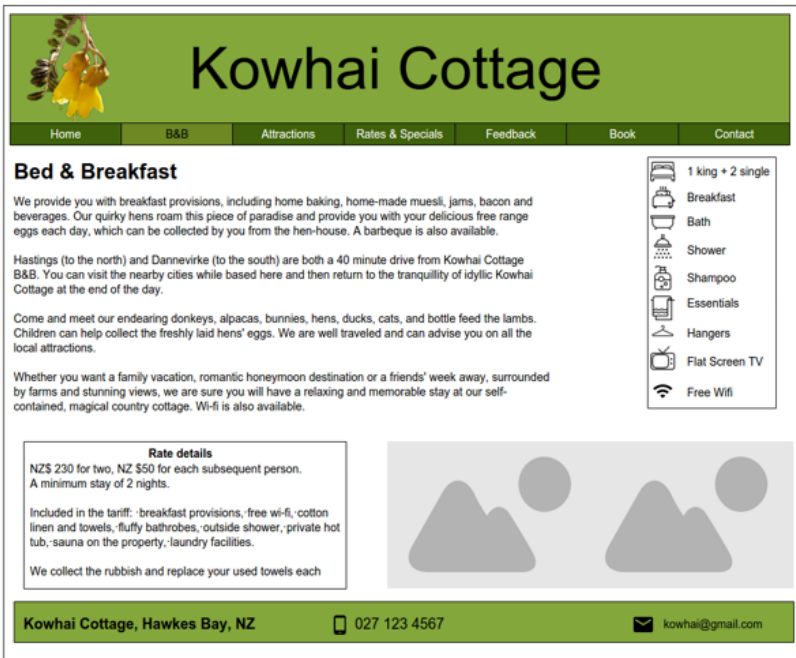

Reasons for Concept 2: This layout is quite different to Concept 1. I decided to place boxes, text and navigation evenly beside each other. I have the navigation on the left side of the page, the text in the middle of the page and a vertical line of images on the right hand side of the page. I personally feel this layout though is quite cramped and that the user would have trouble concentrating with so much going on. I do prefer layout idea 1 as it is nicely spread out and less full on compared to layout 2.

Clients comments:

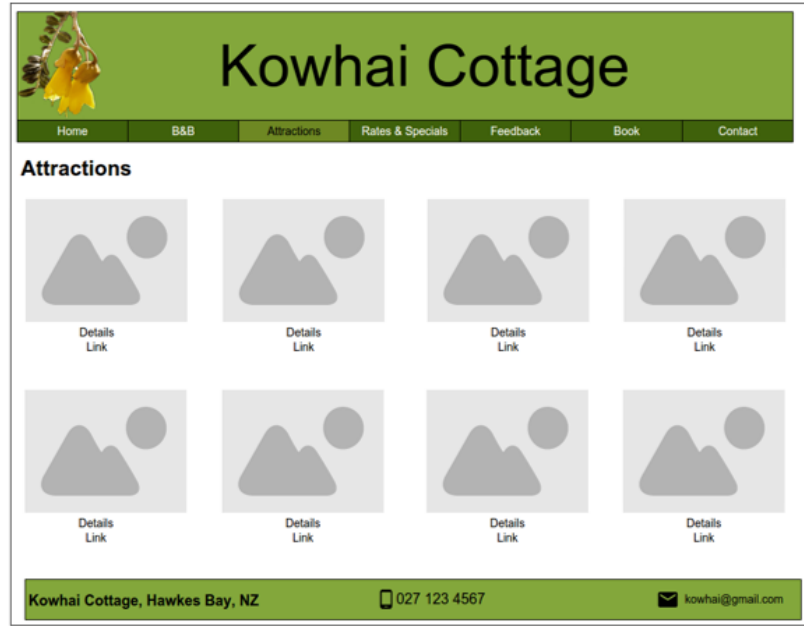
This is also a lovely idea, but seems a bit busy for me. Also there seems to be some empty space below the Navigation Bar on the left. I like the clean design of the first concept.



Reasons for layout of B&B page: This page needed different information to the other pages so I chose the information given to me by the client and selected a format that worked best for the amount of information that needed to be on the page. I had the text information located on the left side of the page as this is where the user of the website will first look. I then added a facilities bar image on the which floats to the right side of the text. This says what will be included in the B&B. I put the box there because this is where the user will next look. I then have a rate details box underneath the text information and 2 images located either side next the box.

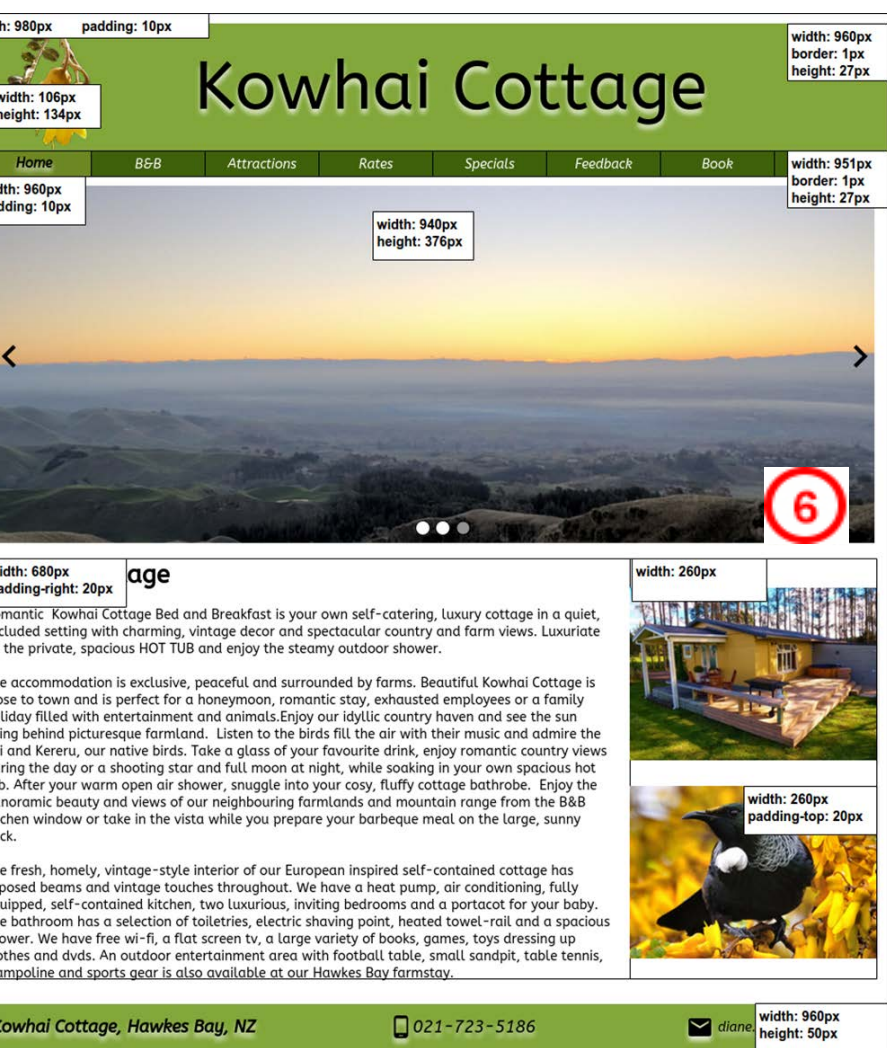
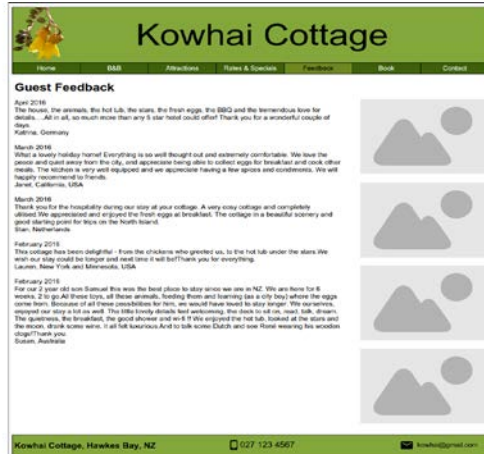
Client comments: Great how this has the same look as the other page, yet is clearly different. The key on the right is great. Would you be able to add a hot tub symbol to the key, instead of the bath. Also I would like you to add laundry to the list. Also could you have "image, rate details, image" at the bottom.

Attractions



Reasons for layout of Attractions page: This page will provide links to other key tourism sites so I decided to have 2 rows of 4 different images of tourist attractions. This layout is not jumbled up and looks evenly spread out and clean to the website user. I put the title of the attraction and the link to the attraction website below the image. The image is a link to the attractions website as well. This is so the user can click on the tourist attraction link without having to leave the website and then have to search for the attraction website themselves.

Client comments: What a good idea. I look forward to seeing this page in action. Rates & Specials



Simplicity

Requirement: "uncluttered layouts allow viewers to focus on your message. Don't overload your site with overly complex design, animation, or other effects just to impress your viewers."

I have kept my pages simple without going overboard on the design. I have kept the main content plain so the viewers are not distracted by special effects and animations. This is so the viewer can focus on the main purpose of the webpage.

I have not added any fancy text to the website. I gave my client 6 options of fonts to choose from which were neat, simple and not anything spectacular, 3 of which were serif fonts and 3 of which were sans-serif. This is so I knew whatever font my client chose, the website would end up with a clean font.

I needed the website to have the "appealing factor", so a few images of/relating to Kowhai Cottage were placed evenly on each page. They would either be placed the bottom of the content or on a vertical line on the right side of the page. This so they wouldn't be too distracting from the content, but also so it would not make the viewers bored whilst reading.

If my webpage did not contain any images, the viewer would easily become bored and uninterested in Kowhai Cottage, although, I should not overload my pages with complex design, images, animation or other effects just to impress my viewers. It should contain enough content and detail so my viewers will well informed about Kowhai Cottage.

I needed to make sure my background did not distract from my main information content. My background consists of yellow kowhai which are very bright. To prevent the background from overpowering the main information, I changed the opacity levels of the background from 100% to 50%. My background is now very subtle and does not distract the viewer's of the page from the main message. I needed to make sure that I do not overload one page with information. This means separating information into separate paragraphs and limiting the amount of information on the page. Also, I need to create separate pages for certain information including, attractions, booking, about B&B, rates, specials and feedback. This is located on my navigation. This way, the viewer does not have to scroll down to find certain information. They can just click on the navigation bar, the page they would like to view with the right information on it.

The **layout** is quite unique, looking spread out yet dense at the same time. Very well placed images with good proximity to the text.

A different **Navigation**, as the links at the nav area are vertically sorted and are pretty much the only links to other pages of the whole site (except for the other companies' logos at the bottom of the site)

Black/White colours as the text/backgrounds, with orange and blue accents every so often, quite an effective colour scheme.

Bountiful images/graphics throughout all pages of the site, from some simple shapes to real-life images. These go great with the lesser amount of text. Most of the headings are actually images.

Design Elements

- Various different shapes were used from some basic graphics (like the blue star at the top) to the orange text box with its unique edge outline.
- No gradients or textures used, just flat colours (sometimes with opacity, like the bike image at the top)
- High amount of white space used, makes the layout seem spacious and not cramped.
- Only major colours used were orange and blue, which have great harmony with some of the images.

1 What did I like? The overlays of images on colours worked very well and gave a good effect on the image itself; I also especially liked the sleekness of the design, with no rounded corners unless it had a special pattern and some regular square shapes.

What didn't work well? I thought that the navigation of the site as a whole was a little weird, as **two links** were given to the same page (though they look like they're relating to different pages) and none of the other pages carry over the design used in the home page, especially the navigation area. If it was, it could make the site more legible.

How can I use these on my design? I feel like there aren't many aspects of this design that go well with the idea that I have, but the variation of layout and graphics could be something from this I can look at.

What can I borrow from this? I might try having a bit more shapes like the 'Our Goal' box, since it gives a good overall effect to the site. Using the "&" as a graphic behind the main text is a particular aspect I'd like to have on my site, mainly on a "-- College" header or something.

How does it meet the brief's requirements?
It would appeal to the target audience; I think it is practical enough so that it's attractive and legible.

Any Problems?
The J-query slideshow using thumbnail images as slide links can be quite hard to code, same with the nav scrolling down with the page.

What do you like? What don't you like? Rating out of 10?

-- I think that the overall layout is quite balanced and works well as a website. The large image slideshow would be a very effective and attractive section of the site. The only negative of this layout would be to better align the headings for articles, i.e. middle heading centred and the right one right-aligned.

--Lim **2** Everything is well balanced, items are evenly spread out along the page. Eyes are drawn into the centre of the page, where a large image from a slideshow will appear. An improvement that could be made to make the page more uniform is that each boxes' sides are aligned to all reach the same point, instead of the article heading boxes sticking out further than the main box, but that could potentially remove the page's uniqueness and character. Overall it is an effective page with unique features.

-- Scott-Hill I believe that your target audience would find this website layout appealing as they would find the JQuery slideshow and other parts of the slideshow attractive and would be an effective way to present digital media types like images in a small amount of space but there may not enough room for text within the 3 sections and maybe confusing for some web users.

Final Layout

This layout is based off of the two more liked ideas from my stakeholder feedback, ideas #1 and #4 (also the drop-down menu from #2). The main aspect that my stakeholders liked in idea #1 that I implemented in this layout was the large image slideshow, which effectively draws the reader's attention to the centre of the page and successfully implements the brief's purpose of "communicating the Education outside the Classroom will be through a Website, where students and parents can interact and explore the range activities available and to get further information." The sections I used in idea #1 were seen as too small, so I used the sections from idea #4 which are larger and have a better suited style to the rest of the page than before. These will also allow for more information to be inputted while making the site feel less cramped, improving overall legibility. I added a drop-down menu in the nav/header area (which scrolls with the page) for easy and familiar navigation throughout the entire site while making the header area look simple and less complicated. Some small links may be used above or next to the drop-down menu, such as the 'contact us' link.

Overall I think this layout fits the brief's specifications of the site being "interactive", "user friendly" and "practical", as I took the better appealing aspects via the stakeholder feedback (the target audience) from each of my four layout ideas; from the less-appealing aspects being changed like the section sizes and heading placement, to the more attractive slideshow and the thumbnail images for each slide being used.

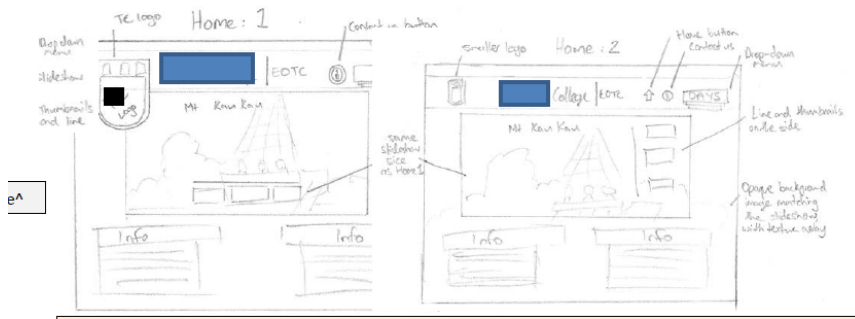
Colour and Font - Idea 4

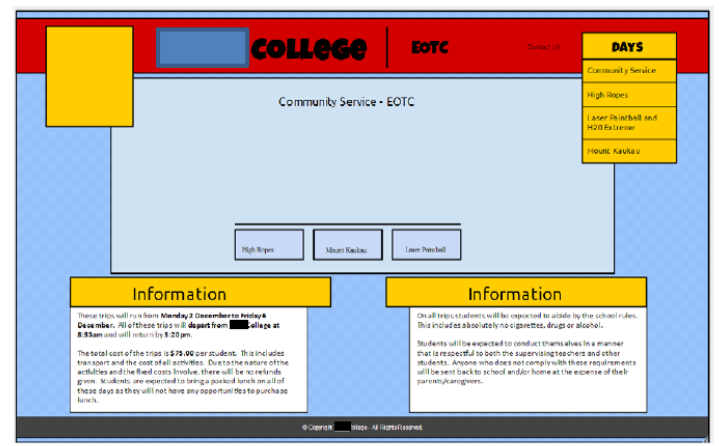
How does it meet the brief requirements? They would successfully and effectively communicate the purpose to the target audience by staying attractive while giving the required information and meeting "Social Acceptability".

I also prefer the JQuery on the first sketch as I prefer the look of having the selector thing on the bottom rather than on the side, I think it looks prettier. Overall I think that the first sketch is better than the second one.

This final concept for the fonts and colours I will use in my website based off of the stakeholder feedback I have collected of my four ideas. This idea itself is mainly based off idea 4, in which the stakeholders gave the highest score out of my four ideas. (All fonts found using "Google Fonts")

The **Refinements** made consist of both mainly fonts, as the colours of idea 4 were greatly credited without much changes requested. I re-used the well-received heading font "Luckiest Guy", which best suited the 'EOTC' theme of the website. One major point of feedback I got on idea 4 was that the sub-heading font (also "Luckiest Guy") was too overpowering of the paragraph text, so I changed the sub-heading font to a little simpler yet not too boring "Ubuntu" which should be effective according to by stakeholder feedback. The main body text stayed at "Calibri" (the font I'm using for this text now) which was used in Idea 4 and is the most readable of the four I used. The only colour change I made from idea 4 (which my stakeholders didn't like at all) was removing the opaque drop down menu and replacing it with a full colour box. The main problem with it was that it wasn't very legible nor did it look appealing to the target audience (my stakeholders).

Final Evaluation

Purpose
I have met the purpose of "communicating the Education outside the Classroom through a Website, where students and parents can interact and explore the range activities available and to get further information" by successfully (according to my stakeholder feedback) creating an educational, interactive and user friendly website plan which provides an insight into Community Service, High Ropes Course, Laser Paintball/H₂O Xtreme and the Mount Kaukau Walk in which the target audience (and the general public) will find both interesting and attractive.

Target Audience
I have met the needs of the target audience by using the target audience (or somewhat close to it) as my stakeholders who gave me feedback on my many ideas and designs. Using this I was able to choose the most liked overall idea and use other liked aspects from others to refine my chosen final. For example, I used the 'home' button icon from my thumbnail sketch two, while using the overall style of sketch one because my stakeholders liked that aspect. This means that everything I ended up with was the result of my entire target audiences preferred features.

Specifications
I have easily met the many specifications of the brief, including having the website within 8 pages (Home, Contact Us, Community Service, Mt Kaukau, High Ropes and Paintball/H₂O) and incorporating the -- College colours of Yellow, Red and Blue (with the more liked idea being used via stakeholder feedback). I'm also using two media types -- graphics and images, while incorporating design elements/ideas from existing websites (research) e.g. The slideshow layout from Bungie.net.

Copyright Law, Ethical Issues, Social Acceptability
None of the images/graphics I am using are from external or out-of-school sources, except for the drop-down menu which I will get permission by the creator to use (via <http://codepen.io/sivaprakash/pen/Bdsoj>) in accordance with New Zealand copyright law. The final website will also incorporate the copyright statement "© -- College 2014, all rights reserved". This would mean that there would be no copyright issues in the website.

I am sure that my site will have ethical and social acceptability, with it being suitable for the wider community since none of my images/graphics are unsuitable in any way nor is the text (which I will be provided with). Anyone who is in the EOTC images I am using have previously given permission for our class to use their images, avoiding the ethical issue of using an image without proper permission. Using my stakeholder feedback (via no complaints or changes suggested) I am able to conclude that the images in my website will be acceptable for the wider audience without containing any Ethical Issues.

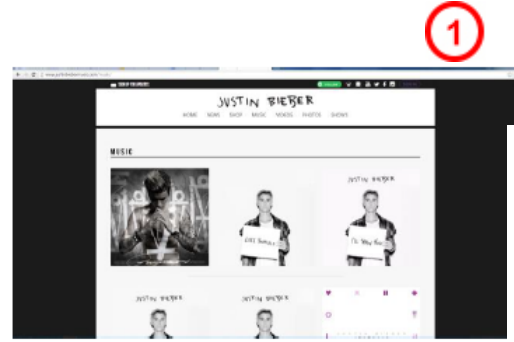
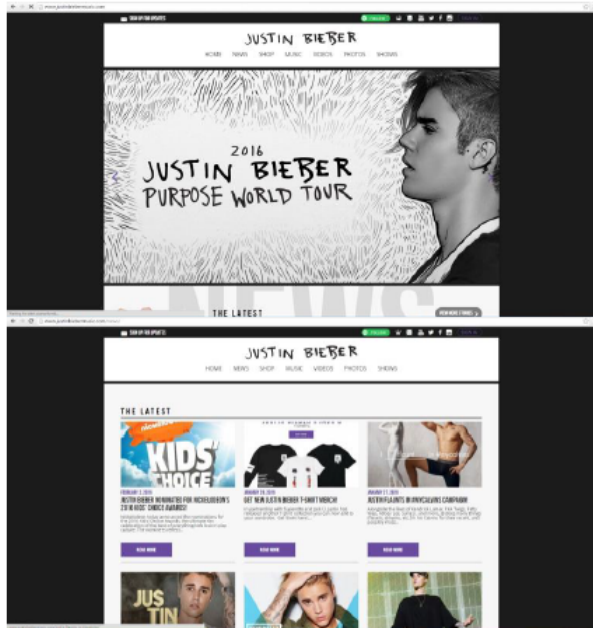
Stakeholders

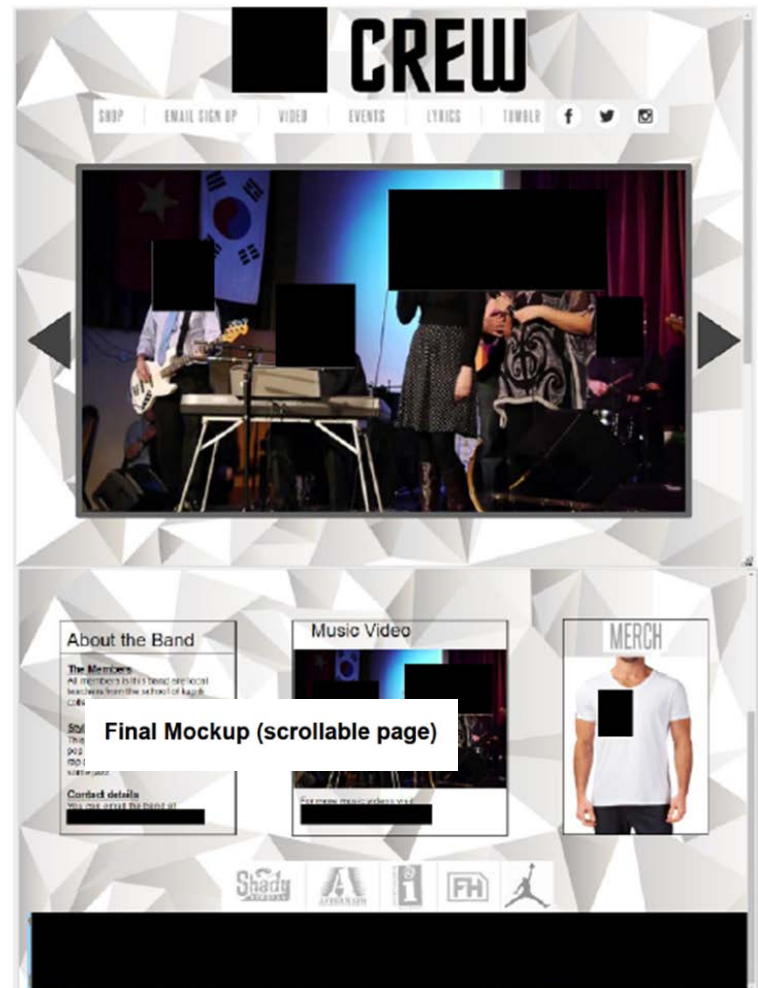
Changes made to this design were moving the social media icons/links to underneath the logo, and adding a footer to the page.

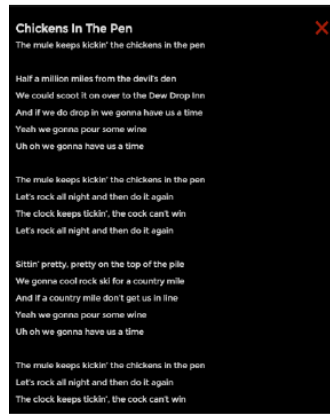
Buttons: This page has buttons on the navigation bar like all other pages that are used to navigate to other pages on the website.

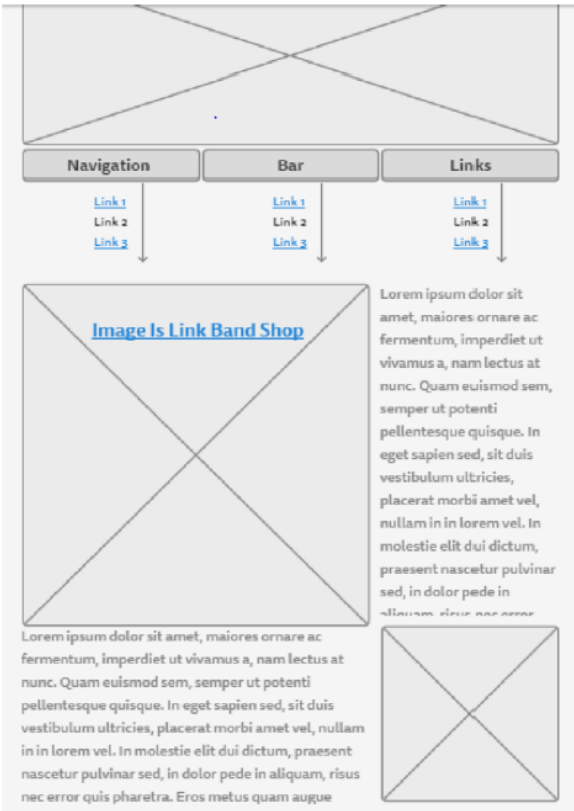

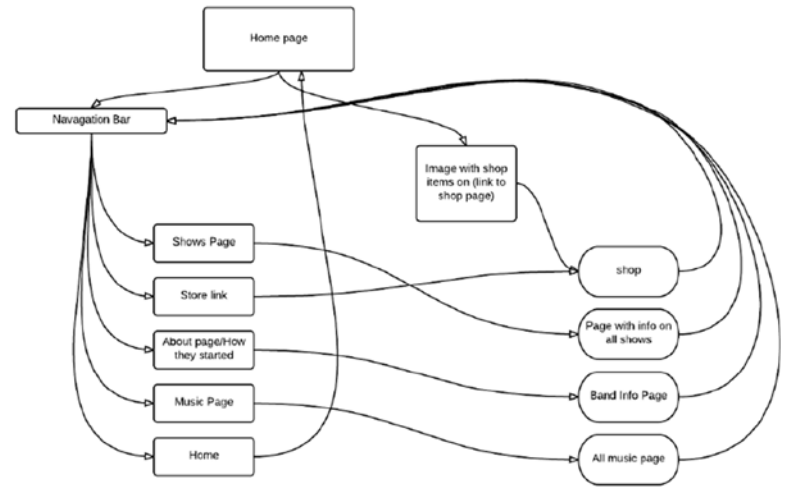
