X20-30 in different sizes ranging in the Russian dolls of five sizes)




DANZER DESIGN

I will ~~break~~ pull apart the Russian dolls or stretch them out or cut with string. They will start off big and get smaller.



I will try to soften the Russian doll to make an object that will have rounded and springy, soft and vulnerable looking.



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



To fill the Maquette I used cotton balls so for the larger scale of the Russian doll, I will use a person to wear the piece. The person in the Russian doll will walk around the quad, ~~and stand~~ to represent the picture on the front of the guard who stands outside Buckingham Palace and guards the Royal Family.


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I could extend the idea of the Russian doll with a person inside it just like the soft version, to see the different reactions to the same object, by different styles of execution. I will cut eye holes so that the people walking past will only be able to see eyes watching them. I drew a moustache, eyebrows, nose and mouth so the face wasn't just blank.


