

# 1 PROPOSAL

I would like to make a machine that makes the fish eggs in bunches, where you push a button and the eggs come out. In a machine like a sculpture.




These are old traditional fish traps/rods that the people of Papua new guinea use. I want to incorporate these traps to my sculpture to show the catching side trapping.

Ice bury the bottom, with blue water to show sea creature.




It will represent the catch aspect of my sculpture folio.

This work very much reminds me of clouds. A road on top of the clouds that people could lay on. To be the first to show your clouds is scale and gravity.




Growth, new world

How successful was it?:




The trap inspired by traps a new Guineas Tribe fishing traps was meant to look like a fish which I managed to achieve. The feather tail although looks reasonable and tribal like, I was not completely happy with it. I would have made it out of sticks and strong like the trap.

This work had the idea of infringement, where a person catches a sea life to do what they wanted with it whether this was for eating, prawning or other. I made it in a fish shape to resemble my theme of sea life and to show that this trap was for fish and sea life. In the original proposal I did not intend to use wire but I used it to make the circular frame on the inside of the scallops, which shapes the sculpture.


How successful was it?:

But the fish I originally wanted to use fake plastic fish or real fish but could not find it so I ended up having to use paper plate ones which looks ok in the image but in life was not that spectacular!



How successful was it?:

This was probably one of the closest sculptures to the plan drawings I had. Although I made a few adjustments it was all for the better and turned out to be quite a successful work. The idea behind this sculpture was that You want to catch the fish but it impossible as the hooks and the fish are in a different jar, almost like when you go fishing and you don't catch anything. The fish are in a way hiding from the hooks that can't catch them. I like how the jar with the hooks isn't a different colour to the water in the main jar. By putting the smaller jar with the hooks into the big jar with the fish I made a very interesting view from the outside.

How successful was it?:
