- 4 Texts used in this unit standard:
 - i must be a minimum of 3000 words in total from two texts. These texts do not have to be equal in length;
 - ii must be assessed on a separate occasion;
 - iii must be at a language level of sufficient complexity to satisfy the academic requirements of university entrance. Vocabulary should be based on authentic texts of an academic nature;
 - iv must have an academic orientation;
 - v may be from sources that include but are not limited to course text book, introductory academic text, non-fiction book, journal article;
 - vi may include graphics, illustrations, subheadings;
 - vii must each be for a different academic purpose.
- 5 Candidate responses may be in any form, which may include but are not limited to tabular, concept map, graphic, written, oral. The medium of the response and the quality of the language in the response will not be assessed for this unit standard.

- The assessor must be satisfied that the candidate can independently demonstrate competency against the unit standard.
- 7 The academic purpose must be approved by the teacher/assessor.
