  - i must be listened to uninterrupted and be repeated once;
  - ii be a minimum of four minutes in length;
  - iii must be one spoken text:
  - iv must be at a level of sufficient complexity to satisfy the requirements of this standard for example, course text book, introductory academic text, non-fiction book, journal article;
  - v should use vocabulary which is based on a text of an academic nature;
  - vi may include visual aids e.g. DVD, digital presentation.
- 5 Candidates must be given sufficient time to take notes and complete the assessment task after the second listening.
- 6 Candidates cannot resubmit this assessment.

- 7 Candidate response may be in any form, which may include but is not limited to table, graphic, written, oral. Responses must not be heard or observed by other candidates. Responses need not be grammatically correct, but errors must not interfere with meaning.
- 8 The assessor must be satisfied that the candidate can independently demonstrate competency against the unit standard.
- 9 Assessment is conducted in a real situation, or in a simulated situation which closely reflects an authentic academic context. This may include but is not limited to lecture, seminar, interview.
- 10 For assessment against this unit standard, the academic purpose must be communicated to the candidate prior to the assessment.
