Guidance Information

1 Definitions

Factors refer to circumstance, fact, and influence that contributes to a result or outcome.

Kaitiakitanga refers to the skills and knowledge needed to support the protection, maintenance and strengthening of the mauri, mana and tapu of tangata Māori and their whānau, through the delivery of culturally appropriate, effective and timely health and or services for whānau.

Manaakitanga signifies as fundamental the ability of whānau centred practitioners, to work with tangata Māori, together with their whānau; in a caring and mana-enhancing way underpinned by te reo, tikanga and kawa where the focus is on the strengths and abilities, not the weaknesses, problems and deficits.

Socioeconomic factors may include but is not limited to educational achievement, mana, status within the community, housing, land ownership, consumerism, employment, income, wealth, assets, crime, gender, and family structure. Many of these factors are interrelated.

Whānau Ora is about empowering whānau to take control of their future; to be selfdetermining (cohesive, resilient and nurturing); confidently participating in Te Ao Māori; to be living healthy lifestyles; to be participating fully in society; and to be economically secure; with initiatives that add value, build upon the strengths and capabilities already present in the whānau, and lead to better outcomes for whānau.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Identify government policies and explain their impact on the socioeconomic factors of whānau with a reference to the principles of kaitiakitanga and manaakitanga.

Range policies may include but are not limited to – health, education and training, justice, housing, employment, resource distribution, resource management evidence of three policies is required.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Policies are identified and their impacts on the socioeconomic factors of whānau are explained.
 - Range evidence of two responses for each policy is required.
- 1.2 Conclusions are drawn and substantiated on the socioeconomic impact on whānau.

Range evidence of two impacts for each policy is required.

Outcome 2

Explain socioeconomic factors and their impact on whānau with reference to the principles of kaitiakitanga and manaakitanga.

Range evidence of six factors is required.

Performance criteria

2.1 Socioeconomic factors are identified and their impacts on the wellbeing of whanau are explained.

Range may include but is not limited to – land loss, life expectancy, population demographics, health statistics, intermarriage, trade evidence of two is required.
