#### How to use this toolkit

This toolkit has been developed by NZQA to guide schools' processes for self-review of performance against the requirements of the <u>Education (Pastoral Care of Tertiary and International Learners)</u> Code of Practice 2021 (the Code).

The tools and templates in this toolkit are optional. There is no requirement to use them.

Self-review can be undertaken and documented in the format that suits your organisation's internal processes.

While there is no prescribed format for self-review, NZQA expects that any effective self-review process will cover certain core components. By considering the processes and questions outlined in this toolkit, you are likely to undertake a self-review that addresses each of those components.

This tool should be used in conjunction with NZQA's <u>Guidelines for Self-review – The Education</u> (<u>Pastoral Care of Tertiary and International</u>) <u>Code of Practice 2021</u>, which outline in more detail NZQA's expectations for sufficient organisational self-review of the Code.

This toolkit should also be used in conjunction with NZQA's <u>Guidelines for Code Signatory Schools</u> — The Education (Pastoral Care of Tertiary and International Learner) Code of Practice 2021.

### A step-by-step guide to effective self-review

This page outlines key steps education providers may follow to effectively self-review their current practices against the requirements of the Code.

#### 1. Prepare

Preparing for self-review is about knowing what you are looking at and why. It includes:

- ensuring you understand the Code outcomes and requirements
- being clear about the questions you need to answer in your review
- identifying the information you need to source (to evidence your Code compliance)
- planning each stage of the review, ensuring international learners and all other relevant people are involved, and determining what you will have at the end of it (i.e. a report, action plan, etc.)

Use NZQA's Guidelines for Self-review to help you prepare for an effective self-review.

#### 2. Gather

Systematically gather information from a range of quantitative and qualitative sources to ensure that you have a sound evidence base from which to make judgements about your practice. Good quality evidence is information that is directly relevant to the questions you are trying to answer.

Refer to <u>Tool A: gap analysis</u> for the areas of practice you need to review, and <u>Tool B: key</u> evaluative questions for suggested questions to shape your information-gathering.

For some parts of the Code, evidencing compliance may be as simple as pointing to a documented policy or wording in a student handbook. Use <u>Tool C: possible evidence examples</u>.

#### 3. Make sense

Look closely at the information gathered via different lenses (i.e. from the perspective of international learners and their whānau) to see what it tells you about your current practices in relation to the Code outcomes sought for your learners.

Use <u>Tool A: gap analysis</u> to identify any gaps in your compliance with required processes.

Return to <u>Tool B: key evaluative questions</u> to consider the effectiveness of your processes, and your organisation's performance against the overarching Code outcomes.

Identify which aspects of your practice are positively impacting on international learners' pastoral care, which aspects need improving, and what evidence makes you think that this is so. Also consider the effectiveness of your self-review process.

#### 4. Decide

Consider what you should do because of what you have learned about your current practices. Use Tool D: action plan template to plan, implement, and monitor any changes you decide to make.

#### 5. Document

Report on your self-review process, findings, and action plan in a format that works for you. Keep this on file, along with the supporting evidence, in case it is needed for external review. Refer to Tool E: self-review report template for guidance on what your report should cover.

#### 6. Attest

Attest to NZQA that your organisation has completed its self-review against the Code.
