- pieces of fruit.

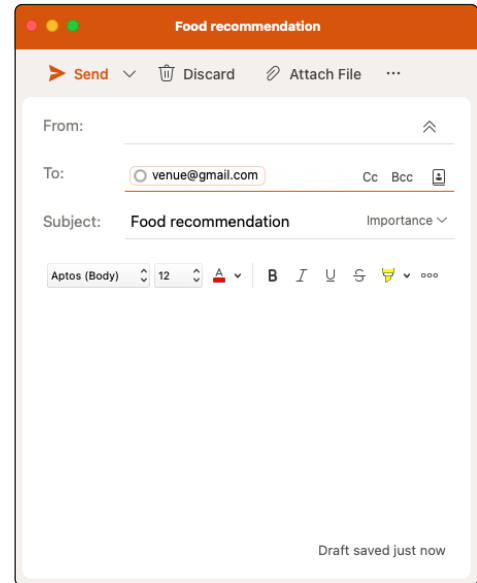

Write an article for a community website on **ONE** of the following topics.

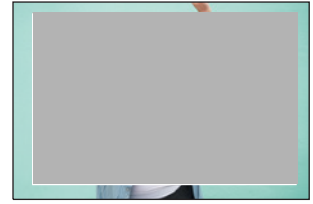
***EITHER* Topic A:**

- doesn't give up.



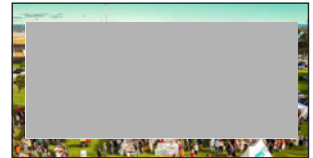
